**Post and Courier:** Economic engine 'humming' in S.C.; jobless rate falls to pre-recession level

Even with flooding disrupting some services in South Carolina in October, the state still produced jobs, surprising a Federal Reserve economist. South Carolina's unemployment rate dropped for a fifth straight month in October to its lowest level in eight years, now down to a pre-recession mark. The rate fell to 5.6 percent, down from 5.7 percent in September, according to the S.C. Department of Employment and Workforce.
