



Cook, Jr. who died intestate on October 3, 1929. That your deponent recalls when the lot on McDuffie Avenue was purchased from H. Jacobs and she knows of her own knowledge that immediately upon the execution of the Deed in 1919 her husband went into possession of the property and paid taxes on it from year to year after 1919 and continued to hold possession of the property until his death in 1929. Clifford R. Cook, Jr. died intestate and upon his death your deponent and the other heirs took possession of the property on McDuffie Avenue and continued to hold possession until the last few months when the property was sold to Clarence Richards. During these years the property was frequently rented and your deponent collected the rents for the use of herself and the other heirs.


Dear Mr. Cooper:
