Dear Governor,


I am writing as a Kairos volunteer requesting a moment of your time to enable literally hundred of volunteers to continue bringing forth the Holy Spirit and the word of God to prison inmates at the Ridgeland Correctional Institution in Ridgeland. South Carolina.

As you may know, Kairos is an ecumenical volunteer ministry with 400 chapters that conduct semi-annually four day missionary program within state prisons and monthly reunions sustaining the faith. In the past four years, 300 of the 1400 inmates at the Ridgeland facility have participated.

These missionary programs are scheduled well in advance to enable the team of forty volunteers and clergy, who go in the prison, to plan their time to complete four eight hour week-end training session, in addition to the four days in prison. Dozen of outside volunteers, churches and organizations provide financial and material gifts and food that is brought into the prisons to feed the inmates participating in the program. **More than 3000 dozen cookies are being baked by hundreds of church women and 350 meals being prepared** for this upcoming October 23-24-25-26th program.

We were informed yesterday that your Director of South Carolina Department of Corrections has ordered a statewide prisoner inventory to be conducted on October 23 and 24th thereby essentially cancelling our previously scheduled program. We are requesting, through your office, a rescheduling of the Ridgeland inventory. I thank you in advance.

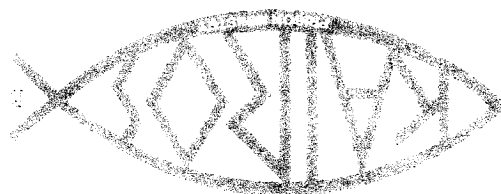

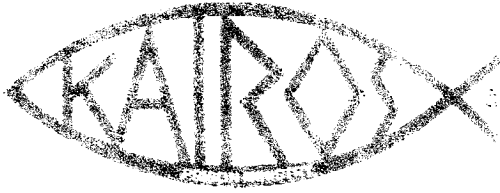
