Dear Nikki Haley,

I was pushed and shoved by a store owner which injured my lumbar where he attacked me from behind as I tried to leave his place of business. He hit me from behind and threw me into a tire machine in which I have had 2 operations on my back which clearly shows the act of Assault & Battery at which time I asked Officer Schofield to arrest this man when he asked me where this happened, that is when I told him at McKinney Tire. He then replied "Jim did this to you?" This is when I realized he knew Mr. McKinney so I requested another officer to take the report, he seemed offended and made the report out in the way he wanted to not according to what my complaint was and never arrested Jim McKinney when I insisted that he be arrested! He never upheld the law! S.C. law for Assault & Battery is enclosed is the statute of law of Assault & Battery way Officer Schofield did not up hold the law section 16-3-600 Assault & Battery. I have requested over and over that this man be arrested why is Jim McKinney above the ~~law~~? Why as a citizen that called the police am I not being heard since August 2014 I have been put off and stalled by Aiken Public Safety. Mr. McKinney appears to be above the law why because he is a white man and I am black. I have appealed and insisted that this man be arrested! Lieutenant Odenthal told me after stalling me for 4 months that I got what I deserved. Well if the justice system works like that I should give Jim McKinney what he deserves this case should be tried in a court of law not in the police station. The constitution of the laws of the United States of America and the state of S.C. was not upheld SCC-Sect 6-16-300 the law of Assault & Battery was not upheld I have been requesting this arrest since August 4, 2014. The law has not been upheld and has failed to protect me as a person and as a tax payer!

Assault and Criminal Sexual Conduct

SECTION 16-3-600. Assault and battery.

(A) For purposes of this section:

- (1) "Great bodily injury" means bodily injury which causes a substantial risk of death or which causes serious, permanent disfigurement or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member or organ.
- (2) "Moderate bodily injury" means physical injury requiring treatment to an organ system of the body other than the skin, muscles, and connective tissues of the body, except when there is penetration of the skin, muscles, and connective tissues that require surgical repair of a complex nature or when treatment of the injuries requires the use of regional or general anesthesia.
- (3) "Private parts" means the genital area or buttocks of a male or female or the breasts of a female.

(B)(1) A person commits the offense of assault and battery of a high and aggravated nature if the person unlawfully injures another person, and:

- (a) great bodily injury to another person results; or
- (b) the act is accomplished by means likely to produce death or great bodily injury.

(2) A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a felony, and, upon conviction, must be imprisoned for not more than twenty years.

(3) Assault and battery of a high and aggravated nature is a lesser-included offense of attempted murder, as defined in Section 16-3-29.

(C)(1) A person commits the offense of assault and battery in the first degree if the person unlawfully:

- (a) injures another person, and the act:
- (i) involves nonconsensual touching of the private parts of a person, either under or above clothing, with lewd and lascivious intent; or
- (ii) occurred during the commission of a robbery, burglary, kidnapping, or theft; or
- (b) offers or attempts to injure another person with the present ability to do so, and the act:
- (i) is accomplished by means likely to produce death or great bodily injury; or
- (ii) occurred during the commission of a robbery, burglary, kidnapping, or theft.

(2) A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a felony, and, upon conviction, must be imprisoned for not more than ten years.

(3) Assault and battery in the first degree is a lesser-included offense of assault and battery of a high and aggravated nature, as defined in subsection (B)(1), and attempted murder, as defined in Section 16-3-29.

(D)(1) A person commits the offense of assault and battery in the second degree if the person unlawfully injures another person, or offers or attempts to injure another person with the present ability to do so, and:

To whom it may concern:

On August 5, 2014 Mr. George Gallman was assaulted by Jim McKinney, a store owner in Aiken SC, who has admitted assaulting Mr. Gallman. Mr. McKinney who is a white man who never called the police to report the assault & battery all though Mr. Gallman who is 64 years old did. Mr. McKinney has not been arrested after many pleas. Mr. Gallman abstained serious lifetime injuries after being hit from behind by Mr. McKinney and thrown into a tire machine-which Mr. McKinney admits to. Why is Mr. McKinney above the law and has not been arrested assault & battery? Hospital records shows damages done to Mr. Gallman's health. Aiken Public Safety has not arrested Mr. McKinney and continue to tell Mr. Gallman that there is an ongoing investigation. Facts of this action taken on a customer by a business owner clearly shows that Mr. McKinney should be arrested for his action. What business is allowed to bring such an attack on their customers? I'm sure if Mr. McKinney would have been attacked by Mr. Gallman who is a black man Mr. Gallman would have been arrested and charged August 5th. Why is Mr. McKinney above the law? He admits to putting his hands on a customer pushing the customer into a tire machine injuring him for life!! Yet no one has up held the law Mr. McKinney appears to be above the law and can beat his customers doing lifetime injury to them and continue to operate his business, admit to it and not be arrested. Mr. Gallman who is a business owner also and has been in the city of Aiken for over 18 years is now in pain for the rest of his life with a damaged lumbar and has to limit his work schedule to as long as he can stand. Where is the justice system? When does it come into play for Mr. Gallman? Mr. McKinney's 2 witnesses, who are his employees, slapped hands and cheered him on during the attack and never called the cops although we live in a common wealth state where when we see someone breaking the law we are supposed to call the police and did not, who should be arrested also. It is a sad day in America when justice is judged by a man's color and the law of assault & battery is dismissed when he is white in the year 2014. Why is Jim McKinney above the law? Does justice not play a role in the customer's life anymore in America? This case should be decided in a court of law not in a police station!!!
