Tropical Storm Colin Report as of 12:00 AM June 7, 2016

Statewide Summary – Moderate rain has been falling along coastal SC throughout the day. County crews are either working or on stand-by in Districts 5, 6, and 7. Crews are monitoring roadways prone to flooding, clearing roadways of fallen trees and debris, and installing road closures as necessary. Additional crews are on stand-by and available for activation if necessary. The public is reminded that flash floods happen quickly and may not be identified with warning signs. If the road is covered with water “turn around, don’t drown”.

Engineering District 1 (Kershaw, Lee, Lexington, Richland and Sumter Counties)

Roadway flooding is not expected in District 1. On-call crews will respond to emergency situations if they arise.

Engineering District 2 (Abbeville, Anderson, Edgefield, Greenwood, Laurens, McCormick, Newberry and Saluda Counties)

Roadway flooding is not expected in District 2. On-call crews will respond to emergency situations if they arise.

Engineering District 3 (Greenville, Oconee, Pickens and Spartanburg Counties)

Roadway flooding is not expected in District 3. On-call crews will respond to emergency situations if they arise.

Engineering District 4 (Cherokee, Chester, Chesterfield, Fairfield, Lancaster, Union, and York Counties)

Roadway flooding is not expected in District 4. On-call crews will respond to emergency situations if they arise.

Engineering District 5 (Darlington, Dillon, Florence, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, Marlboro, and Williamsburg Counties)

Conditions:

Moderate rain has been falling throughout the District 5.

Road Closures:

No flooding or road closures due to flooding have been reported at this time. Dillon County has responded to several fallen trees to clear the roadway.

Staffing:

Crews are on stand-by in each county in District 5. Additional crews are available for activation if needed.

Other:

The contractor who operates the swing bridges is monitor the weather and wind speeds and will respond appropriately based on conditions. The Traffic Management Center (TMC) in Myrtle Beach is staffed, and two SHEP trucks are operating tonight. One is monitoring conditions along I-95 while the other unit is monitoring primary routes (US 501, SC 22, and SC 31) in Horry County.

Engineering District 6 (Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, and Jasper Counties)

Conditions:

Moderate rain has been falling throughout the District 6.

Road Closures:

There are currently 8 roads closed to due to flooding in District 6.
Charleston County has 4 roads closed including 1 primary routes (US 52).
Jasper County has 4 roads closed including 2 primary routes (SC 462 and SC 652).

Staffing:

Crews are active in all counties in District 6 except Colleton. Five additional crews are on standby for activation if needed.

Other:

Engineering District 7 (Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Calhoun, Clarendon, Hampton, and Orangeburg Counties)

Conditions:

Most counties are experiencing light to moderate rain.

Road Closures:

All roads in District 7 are open.

Staffing:

All counties have crews working with additional crews available for activation as necessary. The district office is staffed.

Other:

“Water on Road” signs have been installed on several roads in Hampton County including US 601 and SC 3 as a warning to motorists of possible flooded conditions, but the roads remain open.

The State TMC is monitoring statewide road conditions.
