Since opening in 1999, Saluda Shoals Park has welcomed more than 5.5 million visitors! In fact, the park is the second most visited attraction in the Midlands and is a top five TripAdvisor favorite!

While you may know about the Park's beautiful trails, scenic river trips, excellent event facilities as well as its exciting and unique cultural arts programming – you may not realize one of the most important roles the Park plays – **the role of educating our youth!**

With 400 acres of forested trails and wetlands to explore, Saluda Shoals invites children to experience nature and encourages them to use their imaginations. The Park has offered exceptional environmental education programs and field trip opportunities for more than 12 years. And, our Park Rangers are experienced educators with a passion for connecting children to nature through hands-on exploration. With camps ranging from Outdoor Adventures to Bugs and Beasties, there's something for everyone.

Last year, more than 12,000 students participated in environmental education programs at Saluda Shoals Park. Generous gifts, from donors like you, supported the purchase of 10 microscopes, five IPADS, two projectors and 10 micro-dipping nets for the Wetlands Environmental Education Program. This program gives students the best opportunity to learn by doing! We also provided art instruction to more than 100 Summer Campers who learned about nature through self-expression and creativity.


Most recently, Saluda Shoals Park established an exciting partnership with the Academy of Environmental Sciences at Dutch Fork Elementary School in School District 5 of Richland & Lexington Counties. Unfortunately, this school has some of the lowest test scores in the District. Over the past three years, students “not meeting” the PASS science standards increased from 21% to 28%. To help close this achievement gap, our partnership enables students to explore the natural world, giving real life meaning to academic learning.



