
The members and staff of the Commission want you to have the enclosed statement of Chairman Fred Day concerning Don which was read today at the Commission's meeting.

**Statement of Mr. Fred L. Day regarding Dr. Donald L. Crolley
South Carolina Commission on Higher Education
July 6, 1995**
