Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, autism spectrum disorder can be an incapacitating, lifelong neurological disorder resulting in significant impairment of an individual's ability to learn, develop healthy interactive behaviors, and understand verbal, nonverbal, and reciprocal communication; and

WHEREAS, autism spectrum disorder is the fastest-growing developmental disorder, affecting an estimated 1.8 million Americans and more than 52,000 individuals in the Palmetto State; and

WHEREAS, although the exact cause for autism spectrum disorders has not been found, accurate, early diagnosis and the resulting appropriate education and intervention can help persons with autism spectrum disorder reach their maximum potential; and

WHEREAS, support groups throughout South Carolina and the nation are advocates for the rights, community inclusion, and appropriate education of all persons with autism spectrum disorder; and

WHEREAS, the annual observance of Autism Awareness Month educates families, professionals, and the general public to better understand the lifelong effects of Autism Spectrum Disorders.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim April 2014 as

AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

and April 2, 2014, as

AUTISM AWARENESS DAY

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to ensure that individuals with autism spectrum disorder are accurately diagnosed and appropriately treated throughout their lives.
