Pennsylvania's Governor Earns the Most; Maine's Governor Earns the Least

The average annual salary for U.S. governors in 2015 is \$135,385--up just 0.5 percent from the average in 2014, a new survey by CSG reveals. As in 2014, Maine Gov. Paul LePage earns the lowest gubernatorial salary in 2015 at an annual rate of \$70,000, followed by Arkansas Gov. Asa Hutchinson, who earns \$87,759 per year.

Women currently hold 79 statewide elected executive offices, representing 25.3 percent of the 312 available positions--a significant increase from 1971 when women held only 7 percent of such positions. It also represents a slight increase from 2013 and 2014 when women represented 23 percent of state elected offices.


