We met at the grand opening of the Meeting Street Academy's new building on July 23, 2012. MSA is a stellar example of innovation, thanks to the hard work of its leaders and its financial independence. Spreading the techniques used at MSA via public charter schools is an exciting possibility that I hope can be accomplished. A commentary I wrote for the Charleston Mercury on it is attached.

In addition to passing this commentary along to you, I am writing to highlight the need to add funding for facilities to the SC Charter Act. That need is demonstrated by the difficulties that start-up charters have. It was a huge problem four years ago, when I wrote the attached commentary on this topic. Since then, many more start-up charters across SC have failed to open because of it. The problems being experienced by the LowCountry Leadership Academy TODAY show that the need continues and will severely limit the growth of public school choice.
