Sen. Tom Young (R-Aiken) was elected Chairman of the Aiken County Legislative Delegation during last evening's meeting. Tom replaces Rep. Roland Smith who held that position for 18 years. Roland retired from the legislature after serving in the General Assembly for 26 years.

Election Perspective

Much has been written this past week about Republicans capturing the U.S. Senate and increasing their majority in the U.S. House. We can only hope the shift in Congressional power will bring about constructive governance with a President willing to compromise. As my grandma was fond of saying, "*Proof's in the puddin'!*"

Realistically, real change may be more evident at the state level. Republicans claimed 31 governors' mansions. Most remarkably those included three BIG BLUES: Illinois, Maryland, and Massachusetts. Republicans also gained new majorities in the West Virginia House, Nevada Assembly and Senate, New Hampshire House, Minnesota House, and New York Senate.

In South Carolina, Democrats' goal was to increase their membership in the House from 46 to 50. The Democrats challenge was met head on and thwarted. House Republicans maintained their solid majority with 78 seats compared to the Democrats 46.
