WHEREAS, severe weather can have adverse effects on the citizens of the Palmetto State, often causing loss of life and significant property damage; and

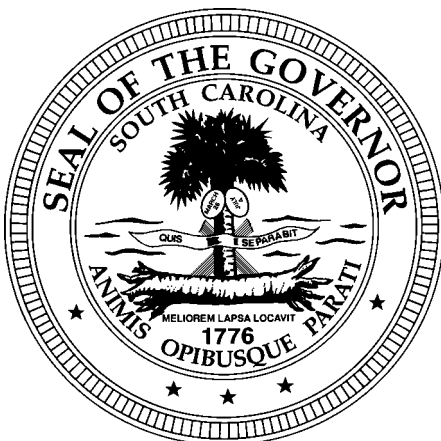
WHEREAS, a well-informed and prepared citizenry reduces the chances of personal injury and death associated with severe weather; and
