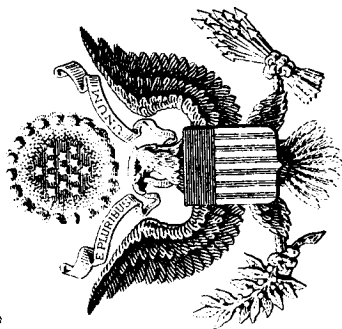

Dear MR. WHITMORE :

Your eligibility for Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) health care benefits and enrollment Priority Group is based, in part, on the financial information you provided for 2013 . VA's Health Eligibility Center (HEC) verifies your financial information to assist you with your eligibility for VA health benefits. Computer matching agreements with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Social Security Administration (SSA) authorize VA to receive Federal Tax Information for the income verification process.

To confirm your eligibility for VA health benefits, we compared the applicable VA National Income Thresholds for 2013 as shown on HEC Form 742-200B with financial information received from IRS/SSA (HEC Form 200-1A).

What Our Records Currently Show

The information we received from IRS/SSA regarding your gross household income is higher than the thresholds and the amount you provided to the local VA health care facility.

How You Can Assist Us

- Review your records and the income information provided by IRS/SSA for income year 2013 (HEC Form 200-1A).
- Let us know if you agree or disagree with the information we received from IRS/SSA.
- Write any corrected information on the enclosed HEC Form 200-1A.
- If there are differences between the financial information provided by IRS/SSA and your records, please send us documents to show why it is different. Examples of these documents include, but are not limited to: W-2 forms, 1099 forms, End-of-Year statements from banks/brokers, etc.
- Certain deductions from gross household income may be accepted to lower gross household income if proof of payment is provided. These allowable deductions include out-of-pocket medical expenses for Veteran's entire household and funeral/burial expenses for spouse and dependent children only. Educational expenses for only the Veteran are also allowable deductions.



Income Verification Process Instruction/Information Sheet

What You Should Know

- Gross household income is defined as income from any source, before deductions, for a Veteran and spouse. If you were married during 2013 your spouse may receive a similar letter.
- If your gross household income was above the applicable means test threshold listed below during 2013 you may be responsible for copays between 11/20/2014 and 11/19/2015 .

2013 VA HEALTH CARE COPAYS

Health Care	Billing Period and Copayments
Hospital	\$1216 for the first 90 days of hospital care and a per diem of \$10 per day
Hospital	\$608 for each additional 90 days of hospital care and a per diem of \$10 per day
Outpatient	No Copayments for Preventive Screenings and/or Immunizations
Outpatient (Primary)	\$15 per each day of outpatient care
Outpatient (Specialty)	\$50 per each day of outpatient care
Medication	\$8 for each 30 day supply of a medication

- If your initial application for enrollment was made after January 16, 2003, and your verified income exceeds the applicable threshold, your enrollment may be cancelled. If so, you may be billed copays for care and prescriptions received during the stated period. You will receive separate correspondence notifying you if your enrollment has been cancelled and providing you with your appeal rights.
