Sarah Ekart is the Aging and Disability Resource Connection Options Counseling Specialist for the DHS Division of Aging Services for the State of Georgia. Her work focuses on person-centered planning and assistive technology solutions. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Journalism and a Master's degree in Gerontology.

Sharee Rines is the trainer and policy writer for Georgia Adult Protective Services and has served in that role since 2010. She has been an active member of the National Adult Protective Services Association (NAPSA) chairing of the Communications Committee, sitting on the Education committee and the Curriculum development subcommittee. Sharee along with other Division of Aging staff worked with EyeOn App to create Georgia's GANE (Georgia Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation) App. Sharee Rines is a graduate of Georgia State University with degrees in Psychology and Sociology.

  - b. The webinar will be broadcast via Adobe Acrobat Connect Pro. Adobe Connect requires the flash player and a high speed internet connection is recommended. Please visit the website [here](#) to test your system to ensure you are able to log on successfully to the event. Please check your computer prior to the webinar.
2. On the day of the webinar:
  - a. Enter the webinar using Internet Explorer or Firefox. These 2 programs are optimal for the webinar system we are using—Adobe Connect.
