## PFS Findings and Recommendations Discussed in Series of Forums

On August 27 and 28, ICS hosted a series of forums in Columbia and Greenville releasing the results of its completed Pay for Success (PFS) feasibility study. The main author, Megan Golden of the New York Wagner School presented her findings. Cristina Shih of Goldman Sachs, Jeff Schoenberg of the Pritzker Foundation, Rhett Mabry of The Duke Endowment, and Thomas Jenkins of the Nurse-Family Partnership also participated during these sessions providing perspective from the various sectors that will be involved in the implementation of the PFS pilot initiative.

On September 17th, the State of South Carolina released a Request for Information on using Pay for Success Financing to improve outcomes and control healthcare costs related to newborn and maternal health of participants in South Carolina's Medicaid program.
