“We had to walk three miles going and three miles coming. We had walked six miles a day going to school,” recalled 95-year-old Sallie Mae Jeter Vinson during an oral history in 2018. She and other children who grew up on the Gist Place (now Rose Hill Plantation State Historic Site) attended rural schools that were segregated by race. These photos show two nearby schools where African-American children, like young Sallie Mae, received their education in the early 1900s: Canaan and Bishop.
