Chattooga Ridge Canopy Tours Near Westminster, SC

Fly through the Trees

It's not for elite athletes only, although a bit of fitness will certainly come in handy. Ziplines are all the rage these days and with good reason. You get a traditional bird's eye view, an exhilarating rush, and a good time with bragging rights.

The Chattooga Ridge Canopy Tours is in the upper, western area of South Carolina. This is apple country and outdoors country. On any given weekend you'll see bicycles, rafters, and folks generally out having a good time. Zip-lining is another option.

When you go, take note (if you can focus) of the forest floor, which is covered in mountain laurel as well as rhododendron, flame azaleas and other remarkable plants. Depending on the time of year, the area can be shockingly beautiful.

A bit nervous? Don't be. The equipment is safety tested, and the Canopy Rangers are trained to industry standards. You'll navigate ground school first, learning safety tips and techniques. A hoist up to the platform gets things going. Then, the fun really begins, with four bridges, 12 ziplines and five zips across Academy Lake. What a way to see a good portion of 19 beautiful acres, including Wildwater Chattooga (for rafting, later), and the lake.

WOW Factor: Are you kidding? Scream factor is more like it. Of course you should be in reasonably good physical condition. Don't indulge if you're pregnant. You'll be trained, and accredited professionals are nearby. Weather permitting, you can enjoy the Canopy Tours during three seasons.

Hint: Leave the cell phone in the car. Wear collared shirts and long pants or long shorts for a more comfortable ride. Stay on the property at a cottage if you'd like to extend the three-hour fun to include river rafting, a whitewater kayak clinic, lake kayaking or stand-up paddleboarding. Save time to explore the quaint mountain towns in the area.

“Seriously Seasonal, Seriously Local, Seriously Delicious”

If you ever watch “A Chef's Life” on your local PBS station, you'll be hooked for life (especially if you love Southern food, the farm-to-fork philosophy, and the ability to be a bit of a voyeur as Chef Howard and her husband, artist Ben Knight, work, play and create spectacular food in Eastern North Carolina.)

It's not all peaches and cream, especially during the segment during which The Chef and the Farmer, their brand new restaurant, has a devastating fire, but what comes through is talent, commitment and a willingness to do the hard work to get the job done while embracing family and raising twins.

It's paid off. Chef Howard and her restaurant have won many accolades – she was selected as a James Beard semi-finalist – and visitors and locals flock to enjoy the creations.

For those of us who have left home only to be lured back, the back

story is familiar. Vivian Howard and her husband, Ben Knight, worked and played in New York. She had become well-known in the Manhattan restaurant world, as well as with her gourmet delivery service. She could have opened a restaurant there, but her parents offered to help her build a restaurant, if she agreed to open it back home in Eastern North Carolina, “a place to which she swore she would never return.”

Today, in Kinston, NC, their restaurant is open and thriving. Her family is part of her daily life and the twins are flourishing. And, the world has gotten to know the family, through the award-winning series, “A Chef’s Life.”

Winner of the Peabody Award in 2013, the series is admired for its honesty, and its “nuanced, non-stereotypical portrait of the rural and small-town American South.”

And now, Chef Howard has partnered with Southern Season to showcase products she finds worthy. *

It’s In His Blood **Ben Owen III, Potter**

He didn’t have a chance to do anything else. First, his forefathers arrived in North Carolina from England in the late 1700s to furnish storage jars for early settlers. Ben’s grandfather, master potter Ben Owen, Sr., admired early oriental pottery he saw and translated it into his own style. Ben III studied pottery with his grandfather, visiting the studio after school beginning when he was eight. He practiced, learned and fell in love with the art. How could he not?

He continued his studies at East Carolina University and his knowledge deepened through travels around the U.S. and abroad to Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Europe, and more recently, China.

Today, his family is the fourth generation to live in the Owen home, located next door to the museum the Owens opened to showcase the traditions and transitions of pottery in their family history. On display are pots from four generations, plus the ancient Chinese pots resembling the ones Ben Owen, Sr. studied in the 1920s and 1930s.
