M I N U T E S

Mr. Lynch was on vacation and unable to attend the meeting.

Mr. Gilreath called the meeting to order and Mr. Alexander gave the invocation. Everyone stood and pledged allegiance to the flag.

Mr. Gilreath introduced Mrs. Eleanor G. Nenstiel who is a professional Parliamentarian and a member of the National Association of Parliamentarians.

On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Alexander, Council voted unanimously to approve the minutes from the June 21, 1983 meeting as mailed.

Mr. O'Neal discussed the following budget transfers for Council's approval.

Mr. Trey Senn reported on the County Road inventory project. Mr. Jeff Randolph informed Council of a \$15,000 grant the Planning & Development Board received from the S.C. Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism that would be used at Broadway Lake.

Mr. Watson discussed vehicle insurance. He stated the only interested vendor was David C. Wakefield and they would stay at last years rates. Mr. Watson asked for approval of Resolution #186 (Disposal of Surplus Property) by Council. Mr. Watson read the resolution. The set date for the auction is July 23, 1983.

Mr. O'Neal presented a list of proposed guidelines for indigent care. He asked that Council approve an additional \$8,500 to be used for pay raises. He asked that the cap be extended to \$25,000. This \$8,500 would come out of the Contingency fund.

On the motion of Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, Council voted unanimously to approve the budget transfers as requested.

On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Alexander, Council voted unanimously to continue with David C. Wakefield for vehicle insurance coverage.

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On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wiles, Council voted unanimously to approve Resolution #186 (disposal of surplus property) auction of sheriff's vehicles.

On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Alexander, Council voted unanimously to transfer \$8,500 from the contingency fund and to put a cap of \$25,000 on employee pay raises. Any persons making over \$25,000 (elected or appointed) would be excluded from the pay increase.

Mr. Cole Sutton asked Council to approve Ordinance #113 (Rules & Regulations for Broadway Lake) on third and final reading. On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Alexander, Council voted unanimously to approve the Ordinance #113 on third reading.

On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wiles, Council voted unanimously to accept the administrator's proposed guidelines for indigent care.

Mr. Rhodes discussed & read an Ordinance to increase the number of persons serving on the Anderson County Hospital Board. On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Alexander, (for discussion) Council voted three (3) against the ordinance and one in favor. Mr. Rhodes voted in favor of the Ordinance.

Mr. Rhodes read a Resolution concerning changing the hours of businesses in Anderson County due to the increased crime rates. Mr. Rhodes moved to adopt this resolution. Motion was seconded by Mr. Wiles for discussion. Council voted three against and one in favor. Mr. Rhodes voted in favor.

On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Alexander, Council voted unanimously to go ahead and put the roads out on bids with the Administrator's approval.

On the motion of Mr. Wiles, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, Council voted unanimously to reappoint Mr. Harold Smith as Chairman of the Fire Commission.

Mr. Wright, County Attorney, presented for Council's approval an ordinance (#114) specifying the introduction, adoption, reading, execution and filing of ordinances, emergency ordinances and resolutions; execution of contracts and legal documents. On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wiles, Council voted unanimously to accept Ordinance #114 on first reading.

Council heard for several concerned citizens.

Council adjourned at 10:15 a.m.
