Combining Forces to Put an End to Veteran Homelessness

SSI/SSDI Outreach, Access, and Recovery (SOAR) is a SAMHSA initiative that helps states increase access to mainstream benefits for people with disabilities who are experiencing homeless or at risk of homelessness. The SOAR initiative helps to improve access to SSI/SSDI among veterans through training of case managers and providing technical assistance to states and communities. By using the SOAR model Supportive Services for Veteran Families grantees help connect eligible veterans to Social Security Administration benefits, income which can lead to sustained housing for persons who had formerly experienced homelessness and can prevent evictions for disabled veterans.

National Child Traumatic Stress Resource - Child Maltreatment in Military Families: A Fact Sheet for Providers

For more than a decade after 9/11, U.S. military families faced historic stressors in conjunction with the deployment of service members to overseas operations. Most military families have coped remarkably well both during and after extended separations and even repeated deployments. Many other military families still struggling with the effects of uncertainty, change, and loss while serving. Child maltreatment and domestic violence have occurred in some of these families, and more military children who have experienced maltreatment are coming to the attention of behavioral health providers within the military system and in the community. This fact sheet profiles child maltreatment in military families. It also reviews for providers the key concepts, findings, and interventions that will support them in their approach to the care of today's military family.
