Teen Pregnancy Rates Hit New Lows

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced in May 2016 that teen pregnancies were at an all-time low. The national rate has fallen to 25.4 pregnancies per 1,000 females, ages 15-19, for the years 2013-2014. Just 20 years ago, the national teen pregnancy rate was more than 100 pregnancies per 1,000 females, ages 15-19. But the rates vary from state to state, ranging from 41.5 per 1,000 in Arkansas to 11.3 per 1,000 in Massachusetts.


