Subject: DHS Clarifies State Extension Requests

Dear Board members:

As I reported to you over the weekend, DHS Secretary Chertoff was quoted in the media stating that a state application for a REAL ID extension is an indication of that state's intent to comply with REAL ID. This runs counter to what we have heard numerous times from DHS since the Final Rule was released.

The DHS website contains additional information on this issue, though not necessarily a definitive clarification. A REAL ID extension "means your State will be moving toward more secure driver's licenses," according to DHS. The deadline for extensions is March 31, 2008.
