Ernie Els' Foundation, Els for Autism, to turn golf blue on April 17th at the RBC Heritage to raise awareness and show support to those affected by autism.

Jupiter, Fla. (April 10, 2015) The RBC Heritage Presented by Boeing PGA TOUR event, taking place at Hilton Head Island, SC, April 13th-19th, is once again supporting four-time Major Champion, Ernie Els and his Foundation, Els for Autism in shining a light on Autism during Autism Awareness Month this April. On **Friday, April 17th**, the Foundation aims to turn the PGA TOUR blue with the help of players, to help drive awareness of a disorder that now affects 1 in 68 children in the U.S. and 1 in 42 boys, as well as show support to the estimated two million individuals affected by autism

and their families.

PGA TOUR Professionals and caddies will be asked to wear blue on Friday and join World of Golf Hall of Famer and four-time Major Champion, Ernie Els in showing support for those affected by autism spectrum disorder. Blue and white autism awareness ribbon pins will be available to players and caddies at the 1st and 10th tees on Friday.

Spectators can also keep a look out for Els' custom blue autism awareness gear. As well as the autism awareness pin, Els' signature lion head cover has once again been turned blue for the month of April and he will also wear a special, blue, I-ONICS Els for Autism Power Sport Band. In addition, BirdieBox has launched an "Els for Autism Box" – that includes a limited-edition collection of golf related products with a percentage of proceeds being donated back to the Foundation. "Since Liezl and I set up the Foundation in 2009, the outpouring of support we have received from people has been phenomenal. In particular we have been humbled by the show of support from my fellow TOUR Players. It means so much to us that they come out here every April and show their support to all of those affected by autism and their families, by wearing our puzzle pin." Said Els for Autism Founder, Ernie Els.

Els added: "This year is the most exciting year to date for the Foundation as this August we will be opening the doors to the first buildings of our Center of Excellence – the Lower School and the Auditorium. The golf community, on both the amateur and professional side, has played a huge part in helping us realize our dream of building a better future for people with autism and I am so proud of the difference that we, as a collective group, are making. The Center will have a positive impact on individuals on the spectrum, their families and the professionals that work with them, not only where we live in Florida, but across the U.S. and internationally."

Throughout the month of April, Els for Autism strives to raise awareness and educates fans and supporters via its social media outlets by sharing educational facts about autism and promoting early detection.

- **GET PREPARED & KNOW THE FACTS** - Els is hoping that viewers and spectators will learn the facts about the early warning signs of autism.
 - Recent studies show that most children are diagnosed after age 4, despite the fact that ASD can be diagnosed much earlier.
 - Symptoms can often be detected by 18 months of age or earlier. When parents first suspect that early signs of autism may be present, they should discuss these concerns with their pediatrician and ask for an autism screening.
 - Research indicates that early identification and intensive early intervention can result in significant positive outcomes for many children with ASD.

ABOUT THE ELS FOR AUTISM FOUNDATION

- The Foundation was established in 2009 by Liezl and Ernie Els shortly after their son, Ben (12), was diagnosed with autism.

- Els for Autism is committed to helping people on the autism spectrum fulfill their potential to lead positive, productive and rewarding lives.

- The Foundation is in the middle of a catalytic project; the establishment of a state-of-the-art Center of Excellence with a local, national and global reach.

- Groundbreaking for the Center of Excellence took place on March 10, 2014 in Jupiter, Florida.

- Once completed The Els Center of Excellence, being built on a 26-acre site, will provide a uniquely designed on-site educational program for 300 children on the autism spectrum ages 3-21. It will also bring together the critical components of early intervention, transition to adulthood, medical and professional services, and adult services all on one campus. At its heart will be a multi-faceted global outreach program that will make best practices in education and therapy available to children, families and autism experts both in the U.S. and internationally.

- Having all the essential components on one campus, with the integrated programing and continuity of service that this allows, will not only be a game-changer for the children in the local area, but positions the Center as the perfect hub for a global outreach program; that will ensure its influence is felt far beyond the boundaries of its walls.

- The Lower School is on schedule to welcome its first students in August 2015, and the Auditorium Building is also on track to become the new home of the Foundation this summer, enabling the team to further develop its global outreach programs using this magnificent, and fit-for-purpose building as its base. In the meantime, the Foundation continues its fundraising efforts to ensure a continuous build schedule for

the remaining components of the Center; the Upper School, the sports facilities, the medical and professional services building and the adult services component.

- In addition, the Foundation recently introduced Ernie Els #GameON Autism™ Golf Clinics, an initiative focused on using golf as a life skills development tool. These have been hosted at courses across the U.S. and most recently South Africa and this year will be extended to include locations in

Canada. The Foundation has plans to roll-out #GameON Autism Golf as a comprehensive program across the U.S. and internationally.
