

STATE INSTITUTIONS VISITED BY BUDGET AND CONTROL BOARD

The State Budget and Control Board assembled in the office of the State Auditor at 10:00 A. M., on September 22, 1954. Board members present at this meeting were Mr. Rhodes, Mr. Verner, and Mr. Bates. Governor-elect George Bell Timmerman, Jr. was also present at this meeting.

During the day the following institutions were visited and inspected by the Board members and Mr. Timmerman.

University of South Carolina
South Carolina State Hospital
South Carolina Sanatorium

The following day, September 23, the Board members and Mr. Timmerman visited and inspected the South Carolina Penitentiary, the Industrial School for Girls, the Industrial School for Negro Girls, and the John G. Richards Industrial School.

On October 1, Mr. Rhodes, Mr. Timmerman, and the State Auditor visited and inspected the Industrial School for Boys, and the Convalescent Home for Crippled Children, both at Florence.

On October 4, Board members Rhodes, Bates, and Verner, and Governor-elect Timmerman met at Whitten Village, at Clinton, and inspected that institution. From Clinton they proceeded to Cedar Springs and inspected the S. C. School for the Deaf and the Blind. From Cedar Springs the party proceeded to Clemson College where a conference was held with the College authorities, and an inspection of the College facilities was made on the morning of October 5.

From Clemson the Party proceeded to the John de La Howe School, in McCormick County, for an inspection of that institution, and from there the party returned to Columbia.

On October 11, Board members Rhodes, Bates, and Verner, accompanied by Governor-elect Timmerman and the State Auditor, met at the South Carolina State College at Orangeburg and inspected the facilities of that institution.

From Orangeburg the party proceeded to Charleston where an inspection of The Citadel plant was held that afternoon.

The next day, October 12, the S. C. Medical College facilities, including the teaching hospital now nearing completion, were inspected and after this inspection the party returned to Columbia.
