Associated Press: Haley to advocate efforts to combat domestic violence

Gov. Nikki Haley will use her State of the State address to advocate her budget request aimed at combatting South Carolina's dismal domestic violence statistics. Haley is expected Wednesday to promote her \$11 million budget request for hiring 144 prosecutors statewide.

A Senate committee unanimously agreed on Wednesday that interim South Carolina Department of Transportation Secretary Christy Hall should hold the job permanently, and forwarded its recommendation to the full Senate. But the Senate right now can't agree on much else about South Carolina roads.

Note: Senate President Hugh Leatherman has ordered four Democratic senators and four Republicans to talk behind closed doors to come up with a solution. Gov. Nikki Haley has said she will back any deal that includes more money for roads - even through an increased gas tax; an equal tax cut, likely on income taxes; and restructuring of the board that runs the DOT. Most lawmakers agree all three items are necessary to get something passed.

The Senate Transportation Committee on Wednesday unanimously recommended Senate confirmation of State Transportation Secretary Christy Hall, then unanimously and quickly approved a resolution to permanently allow the governor to appoint the transportation secretary.

Note: A year ago, in her annual speech to the Legislature, Gov. Nikki Haley proposed raising the state's gas tax by 10 cents per gallon if lawmakers also scrapped the present system of selecting highway commissioners and reduced the state's income tax.

The State: Education chief asks for \$481 million more for K-12 schools

South Carolina's schools chief wants state lawmakers to spend nearly \$481 million more on public education next year. Most of the money would benefit the state's lowest-performing school districts, Education Superintendent Molly Spearman told a House K-12 budget-writing panel Wednesday.

Note: The new spending also would include more money for students enrolling in college-level courses, something S.C. Gov. Nikki Haley is pushing as a way to make sure S.C. high-school graduates are prepared for college or careers.

The museum that will house the Confederate flag removed from Statehouse grounds last summer needs to relocate to attract more visitors and become more self-reliant, legislators on a House budget-panel said Wednesday.

Note: Last week, Gov. Nikki Haley said \$3.6 million is still too high, but she did not recommend an amount. Instead, she put a \$1 placeholder in her budget request.

Note: "We didn't want to discount it. We said we think it should be in a museum, and we want it be in a place of respect so people would feel good about, but the General Assembly needs to work on what that price tag is," she said Friday in releasing her executive budget.
