Historical Information:

Five privately owned, small store buildings once fronted Emma Cudd Road across from the Glendale Mill Village. The former LeMaster (later Hopper's) Grocery held, as its name indicates, first Hopper's then LeMaster's, grocery store. With the Walter Reaves, Sr. Lunch Room (site #1637.01), the Claude Reaves Store (site #1638), Dillard's Meat Market (site #1648), and Reaves Barber Shop (site #1649), this store is recommended as contributing to the NRHP-eligible Glendale Mill Village HD due to its close connection with the village and its residents.
