Winter Storm Report

For Districts 3 & 4

January 24, 2016

Engineering District 3 – All interstates in District 3 are reported as clear. Crews continued to treat any wet areas throughout the night on the interstates as well as many primary routes. Crews also responded and treated hot spots called in by highway patrol.

Greenville County - Crews continue working on US 276 over Caesars head. Progress is being made, but still icy spots. All other primaries are in good condition with minor ice spots. Crews will continue working on secondary routes throughout the day in the mountain region.

Oconee County - All primaries are clear with minor ice spots. Crews will continue working on secondary routes throughout the day in the mountain region.

Pickens County - All primaries are clear with minor ice spots. Crews will continue working on secondary routes throughout the day in the mountain region.

Spartanburg County - Primaries below I-85 are clear with only minor spots of ice. Primaries in the northern part of county are 80% clear with scattered ice spots.

TMC, SHEP, and District Office have returned to normal operations. Crews will continue to work throughout the day today to clean remaining ice spots on all roads. With rising temperatures, it is anticipated that all counties will stop 12 hour shifts at 8pm tonight and all work afterwards will be handled by on-call or skeleton crews.

Engineering District 4 – All interstates are reported as clear and dry.

Cherokee County - All primary routes have pavements reported dry with only isolated wet/icy spots. Some paved medians still have slush. These areas are expected to be dry by 1700 today. Secondary routes are reported as 70% dry. 30% continue to have areas of icy spots remaining in shaded areas. Crews will continue to work these areas throughout the day. Crews will return to normal operation at 5:00pm with on-call crews working handling overnight calls.

York County - All primary routes have pavements reported dry with only isolated wet/icy spots. Some paved medians still have slush. These areas are expected to be dry by 1700 today. Secondary route pavements are reported as 70% dry. 30% continue to have areas of icy spots remaining in shaded areas. Crews will continue to work these areas throughout the day. Crews will return to normal operation at 5:00pm with on-call crews working handling overnight calls.

Chester/Chesterfield/Fairfield/ Lancaster/Union Counties – 100% of Primary Routes reported as dry. Secondary routes are reported as dry with only isolated spots of water/ice. Crews have returned to normal operations with any calls being handled by on-call crews in these counties.

SHEP, TMC, and District Office have returned to normal operations. All assistance crews have been release and are returning to their home counties.
