Hi Chaney,

I'm wondering if Gov. Haley would be willing to talk with me about steps to increase dialogue among races, religions in South Carolina in the wake of last week's tragedy.

I know the state already has a Human Affairs Commission, but some people who I have talked to down here noted that agency normally doesn't get involved until someone has a specific problem or a complaint.

These people are hoping for some more organized forum where a serious conversation could occur that would highlight differences that cause irritations and differences that unite. There is some thought that this – like the removal of the flag from the Statehouse grounds - would be a positive outcome.

Please let me know what might be possible. My deadline is not today, but I'd like to get a sense of things tomorrow.
