Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, carbon monoxide (CO) is a leading cause of accidental poisoning death in the United States, resulting in more than 400 fatalities and 15,000 emergency room visits each year; and

WHEREAS, known as the silent killer, CO is a colorless, odorless, tasteless gas that results from improper or faulty combustion and ventilation of fuel-burning appliances; and

WHEREAS, the incidence of CO poisoning increases in the winter months when people are turning on their heat and using fuel sources for food and warmth; and

WHEREAS, carbon monoxide detectors provide protection against deadly CO poisoning in homes, apartments, dormitories, hotels, and other dwellings that include a fuel-burning source of heat.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim November 2014 as

CARBON MONOXIDE AWARENESS MONTH

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to raise awareness of the risks and dangers of carbon monoxide and to take steps to protect against it.
