State Government News

Increase in Projected General Fund Revenues : Two weeks ago, the State's Board of Economic Advisers projected a revenue increase for next fiscal year of over \$1.2 Billion. My understanding is that some of the projected money is already obligated by existing state law for public education. I support returning some to the state's taxpayers and using some for the state's road and bridge infrastructure needs especially following last month's flood. Other competing interests for portions of the money are expected to be funding the Local Government Fund at the current statutory formula amount; paying for capital improvements on state college and university campuses; and paying for salary increases for state employees. Employers Save on Unemployment Tax : The state's federal unemployment tax rates for 2016 will drop 5.4% from the past year. To learn more, go [here](#).
