The Easley Police Department will soon be implementing a new form of technology to better assist their officers: body cameras. "We have them here, but under the new state law, our policy has to be approved by the state law enforcement training camps," said Easley Police Chief Tim Tollison. "So that's where we're standing at right now."

Note: In June 2015, Gov. Nikki Haley signed into law a bill that would require all law enforcement agencies to wear body cameras as well as to draft policies on which officers would wear the cameras, how video from the cameras would be stored and when officers should and should not be recording.

The Citadel has punished 14 cadets for their involvement in a Dec. 9 incident in which freshmen wore pointed white hoods in an upperclassman's barracks room.
