We will be extending an invitation for you to participate in the Conference on Getting Results in Juvenile Justice sponsored by The Pew Charitable Trusts ("Pew") in Burlington, Vermont on July 17th – 18th, 2014. As you know, the purpose of the conference is to bring together a select number of state teams, including representatives from the legislative, executive and judicial branches, to explore issues and solutions in the juvenile justice field.

After conducting an internal review of your state's applicable ethics rules, we have determined that Pew may be able to provide reimbursement for reasonable travel, lodging, meals and related expenses in order for you to attend the conference.
