The houses that were on the property when I was growing up are both gone now, but the orange iron tractor wheel mailbox post is still there. We dug half way to hell and anchored it in concrete. Over intoxicated customers from Mr Armstrong's store kept turning around in our driveway and knocking down the mailbox. My dad took care of that problem

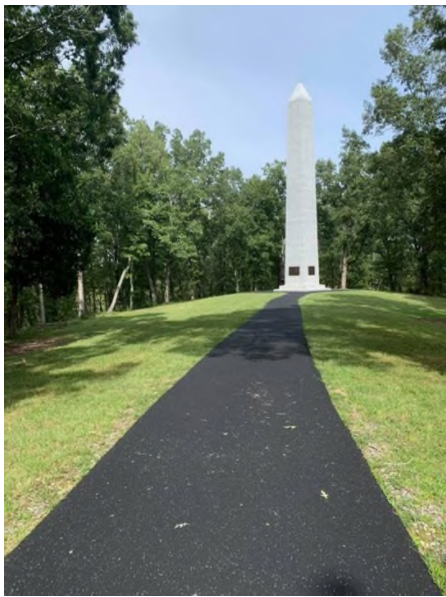
