Seeking the renewed support of those countries; Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, North Korea, Russia, China and now Cuba (The Cuban Interrogation wartime teams used in Vietnam to interrogate and at time murdered our U.S. captured prisoners of war) to locate, recover, identify and return our missing in action.

Sadly, many of our U.S. missing remain just that ...abandoned in place in unmarked graves in and around the may wartime POW camps and cemeteries.

We have confirmed from two sources inside Vietnam alone that none of these former wartime POW campsites/cemeteries have been visited. As shared with us..." Gene it takes only special permission from the Vietnam officials to enter those areas in the north ".

In closing, once again we, the many veterans that I have spoken with ...do support your nomination.
