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Subject: Tropical Depression 2

Yesterday, upon closer inspection by the Air Force recon flight, 91L was upgraded to a tropical depression, known as TD 2, presently 270 miles SE of Charleston tracking NW at 13 mph. A tropical storm warning remains in effect along our entire coast.

Forecast:

TD has a very brief window to attain tropical storm status as it passes over the Gulf Stream tonight; 45 mph tops, which is not considered likely.

Effects on SC:

TD 2 is expected to scrape along the beach Sunday and Monday bringing 2-4 inches of rain and gusty 20-30 mph winds. SC has summer thunderstorms worse than this TD. Most likely threats include localized flooding and power outages, neither of which would normally require any state assistance.

Counties:

EMD will check again this morning but it is unlikely that coastal counties will be changing operational conditions or planning any specific actions other than keeping their EOC staffs informed.
