Proclamation

WHEREAS, brachial plexus injuries affect the network of nerves that control the muscles of the shoulder, arm, elbow, wrist, hand and fingers and can result in full to partial paralysis of one or both arms; and

WHEREAS, though brachial plexus injuries can occur as a result of trauma such as automobile, motorcycle, or boating accidents, sports injuries, animal bites, and gunshot or puncture wounds, they most often occur during the birthing process; and

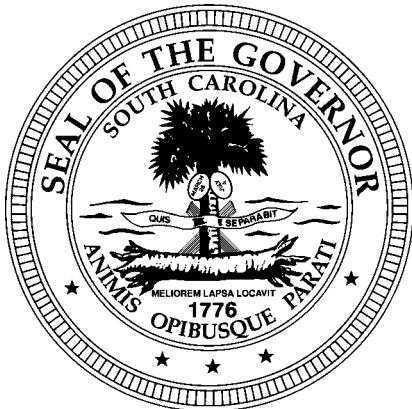
WHEREAS, persons affected by brachial plexus injuries experience pain in their muscles, joints and ligaments, weakness, atrophy and numbness of the affected limb, and possible respiratory difficulties; and

WHEREAS, the 2002 observance of "Brachial Plexus Injury Awareness Week" helps raise awareness of the prevention and treatment of brachial plexus injury.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Hodges, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 13 – 19, 2002, as
