Dear Secretary Vilsack,

On behalf of the State of South Carolina, I am writing to request a Secretarial Disaster Designation for three counties in the State of South Carolina for peach crop losses following freeze conditions in March and April of this year: Cherokee, Greenville, and Spartanburg Counties.

As documented by numerous local and national weather stations, freezing temperatures in South Carolina occurred when much of our peach crop was in the 50% bloom stage and, later, in the shuck split and shuck off stage. Specifically, farmers in Cherokee and Spartanburg Counties suffered a loss of 50% of their peach crop, and farmers in Greenville County suffered a loss of 35% of their peach crop. Should you approve my request, the affected farmers would be eligible to apply for low interest emergency loans, helping to mitigate these significant losses.
