The Greenville News did a series on the SC Mentor program (private provider the state uses) to care for vulnerable adults earlier this year which the IG is delivering a report on soon. Tim is following up on that, he's been writing related stories to put into context how the state deals with abuse and neglect of vulnerable adults.

Sen. Scott feels DDSN would be held more accountable as a cabinet agency. He has long advocated for change at DDSN and is concerned that they have not implemented recommendations from the legislative audit council. He did not mention the governor personally in any of his complaints, nor has anyone else in the story.
