Did you know.....

A once thriving beach resort town, Edingsville is now submerged beneath the waters of the Atlantic Ocean, just northeast of Jeremy's Inlet at Edisto Beach State Park. Edingsville was developed in the 1820s by the Edings family, who were prominent planters on Edisto Island. Summer homes were built there in order to escape what was known as the "Country Fever", a malarial sickness transmitted by mosquitoes. Following the American Civil War, Edingsville fell into decline, and the hurricanes of 1885 and 1893 devastated and washed away most structures at Edingsville. Now a distant memory, the only traces of this beachside community are artifacts such as ceramics, brick, and glass that wash in with the tides! The painting pictured was created by Cecil Westcott, a native islander, and depicts what the community once looked like. The map pictured shows the location of Edingsville on an 1862 map, in relation to the location of the state park. The artifacts pictured are from Edingsville, and are exhibited in our Environmental Learning Center.
