For Gov. Nikki Haley, something as simple as the way someone answers the telephone can make a difference in recruiting industry.

Note: “As silly as it sounds, we had all of our public servants in South Carolina start answering the phones with ‘It’s a great day in South Carolina, how may I help you?’,” Haley said this week before a federal panel of business leaders looking to improve foreign trade.

Note: “They hated that so much,” Haley said of state employees’ reaction to the mandate. “But the whole point was that we wanted them to enjoy where they work and to remind them who it was they work for.”

GSA Business: S.C. pays off nearly \$1B federal loan to cover jobless benefits

South Carolina has paid off a nearly \$1 billion federal loan used to help cover unemployment benefits since 2008. The South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce made the final \$120 million payment today to the U.S. Department of Labor, ahead of the scheduled November deadline.

Note: “Restoring solvency to the state’s unemployment trust fund is another step in our state becoming debt free,” said Gov. Nikki Haley, who announced the news at a Statehouse news conference along with DEW executive director Cheryl Stanton and members of the General Assembly. The early payoff “is quantitative proof that our citizens are finding work, businesses are strengthening our workforce and economy, DEW is cracking down on fraudulent claims and South Carolina is open for business,” Haley added.

South Carolina legislators' chief responsibility when they reconvene Tuesday for a special session will be passing a state budget for the fiscal year that starts just two weeks later. But with parts of the budget package still up for debate on both chambers' floors, it appears highly unlikely a final spending plan will be possible before July 1. A six-member committee of House and Senate members must reach a compromise on the chambers' differing spending plans.
