Re: South Carolina Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Ms. Patel:

Pursuant to the provisions of the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act, S.C. 30-4., Judicial Watch, Inc. requests from the Office of the Governor access to and a copy of the following within a fifteen (15) business days:

1. All records concerning, regarding, or relating to Governor Haley's February 2012 trip to Washington, D.C., for the Republican Governors Association (RGA) Winter meeting;
2. All meeting agendas, notes, and memoranda concerning or relating to the aforementioned February 2012 RGA Winter meeting;
3. All records of communications concerning or relating to the aforementioned February 2012 RGA Winter meeting.

Public records include all books, papers, maps, photographs, cards, tapes, recordings, or other documentary materials regardless of physical form or characteristics prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or retained by a public body. S.C. 30-4-20(c).

If access to the public record is not granted immediately, the custodian shall give a detailed explanation of the cause for further delay and the place and earliest time and date that the record will be available for inspection. If this request is denied you are required to provide a written statement of the grounds for such denial. Such statement shall cite the specific provision of law under which access is denied and shall be furnished to the requester no later than the end of the third business day following the date that the request for the statement is received. S.C. 30-4-30(c).

Any reasonably segregable portion of a record otherwise exempt from disclosure is required to be made available after deletion of the portions that are exempted by law. S.C. 30-4-
