Good Afternoon Katherine,

I had the opportunity to meet with Governor Haley yesterday evening at Dr. Singh's residence in Mt. Pleasant, where we heard about her meeting with Indian Prime Minister Mr. Modi in New York, and his subsequent invitation for her to visit India in November. I have lived in the US for over twenty years, and call SC my home. My interest in the Indian healthcare industry developed over the past decade, when I was invited to deliver a keynote address at the World Healthcare Congress in Abu Dhabi. This gave me an opportunity to meet a number of CEO's from India and learn about developments and advances in the Indian healthcare industry (\$155 billion in projected revenue by 2017).

I was subsequently invited to India, by Apollo Health Group for their Inaugural International Congress on Patient Safety in 2011 and, delivered the keynote addresses on the Malcolm Baldrige Performance Excellence Award. I then, returned back in 2012 to Hyderabad, to deliver a keynote on Sepsis and Joint Commission Disease specific certification. My interactions with healthcare leaders in India have made me think about how I can better collaborate/consult with where the healthcare in India is heading.

If healthcare is going to be discussed during the Governors India trip and if appropriate, I would like to join the delegation to India. In fact, this would be a great opportunity for me to help/serve and connect India with South Carolina, in making the vision of providing clinical excellence to deliver care, that is truly efficient, effective, timely, safe, equitable and patient centered a reality.
