Hope things are well with you. Trying to respond to a request from our IRS reviewer regarding the Certificate of Incorporation for CYC. I am on the SC Secretary of State's website and it looks like there was an amendment to the

Certificate filed 12/14/1998 which was not provided when the SoS sent the Certificate last year. Any way you can see if we can get a copy on an expedited basis – the IRS is requiring an amendment to clearly state that the purpose of CYC is non-for profit and that upon dissolution its assets will be disbursed to another 501(c)(3). All pretty straight-forward stuff so trying to see if the 1998 amendment address that issue. If not I will file an amendment. Under some time constraints as we need tom completed and respond in the next 10 days.

Since you had some contact (and maybe some attention getting from Mr. Bryant) I thought it might be best to start with you rather than get caught in the bureaucracy.
