### DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF SOUTH CAROLINA

January 18, 2007

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The regular monthly meeting of the Department of Transportation Commission was held at the headquarters building in Columbia, South Carolina at 1:30 p.m. In compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, the news media was advised in writing of the time, date and place of this meeting.

SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of December 19, 2006; copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving an amendment to the 2007 STIP, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the sale of surplus right of way property, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist with the development of the widening of US 76 from I-95 to Aire Acres Road in Florence County, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist with the development of the extension of SC Route 31 from it's existing terminus at SC Route 544 to SC Route 707 in Horry County, as shown in detail in the Appendix.



SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist with the development of a new overpass over US Route 501 in the town of Aynor, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 7: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist with the development of a new interchange at SC Route 707 and US Route 17 Bypass in Horry County, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 8: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to solicit and negotiate professional services for the purpose of providing bridge maintenance services for the Ravenel Bridge and other selected bridges located in coastal counties, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 9: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to seek qualified firms to provide project management and construction engineering and inspection services for the US Route 17 (Ace Basin) Phase I design/build project in Beaufort County, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 10: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous contracts to include additional resurfacing work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 11: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 12: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department related to roads in the State Highway Secondary System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 13: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department concerning projects in the highway letting of December 12, 2006, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 14: Commissioner Jones reported for the Invitations and Resolutions and made a motion to approved a concurrent resolution naming the portion of US Highway 17 North from it's intersection with Venning Road to the intersection of Sewee Road in Charleston County the "Sweetgrass Basket Makers Highway", as shown in detail in the Appendix. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stevenson and passed unanimously.

SECTION 15: Commissioner Jones reported for the Legislative Committee and made the following motion:

*"I move that we adopt the SCDOT Congressional High Priority List that was approved in the committee and the policy that established the list".*

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stevenson and passed unanimously. A copy of the approved SCDOT Congressional High Priority List and policy is shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 16: Commissioner Stevenson reported for the Mass Transit Committee and made the following motion:

- 1) To increase the fiscal year 2006-2007 State Mass Transit Funds allocation by \$25,439 to supplement Beaufort County's Daufuskie Island Ferry Transportation service; and
- 2) To approve an annual recurring allocation of up to \$50,000 in State Mass Transit funds, based on a demonstrated need, to support the Daufuskie Island Ferry Transportation service.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones and passed unanimously.

SECTION 17: Chairman Hooper asked Mr. Mo Denny to report for the Finance and Administration Committee. Mr. Denny reported that the committee had met and received a draft of the CPIP for a thirty-day review. Approval will be requested at the next meeting of the Commission. The committee also received a report on the 2007-2008 "C" fund match program and an update on the state of the DOT finances. No action was requested by the committee.

SECTION 18: On motion of Commissioner Atkins, seconded by Commissioner Jones, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to terminate payment of legal fees and costs for the challenged Commissioners in the lawsuit challenging their position as Commissioners effective January 8, 2007, the date of the Supreme Court ruling.

SECTION 19: Commissioner Atkins reported for the Personnel Committee. The committee gave notice that a motion to amend the bylaws to provide that the Director of Audits report directly to the Commission will be presented to the Commission for action at its next regularly scheduled meeting. A copy of the proposed amendment was provided to the Commission and is shown in detail in the Appendix. The committee also received a report on the Employee Survey. There was 80% participation in the survey. The results will be posted on the SCDOT internet site and focus groups will be used to evaluate the responses.

Commissioner Atkins also gave the each Commissioner a "Code of Ethics" draft for their review. He will request adoption of the Code of Ethics for the Commission at the next meeting.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Commission went into Executive Session at 3:15 a.m. for the purpose of discussing personnel matters.

OPEN SESSION

The Commission returned to Open Session at 3:32 p.m. Chairman Hooper reported that no action was taken.

SECTION 20: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 3:35 p.m.

## **Surplus Property Public Notice**

**January 18, 2007**

In accordance with the State of South Carolina Statue 57-5-340, by this publication the Department is making public the Surplus Property Real Estate Transactions to the State Highway Commission. The following sheets include a breakdown of surplus property real estate transactions. These transactions may have resulted from negotiations with property owners during right of way acquisition, direct sales, settlement of a condemnation action, and/or corrective actions to previously reported sales.

1. File 37.108B / Road S-488 / Oconee County / Third District

During construction of improvements on Road S-488, under File No. 37.688, in Oconee County, near the City of Seneca, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-448 by Right of Way Easement from Emhart Industries, Inc. dated October 3, 1989, at no cost to the Department.

Included in the Easement from Emhart Industries, Inc. was right of way for a plant entrance that is currently in the name of Borg Warner Powertrain Systems, which is under lease with Oconee County. Borg Warner Powertrain Systems requested that the right of way for the plant entrance be returned to the adjacent landowner. Oconee County is in complete agreement with this request. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.26 of an acre of land to Oconee County was executed on December 11, 2006.

2. File 4.2003 / SC Routes 8/81 / Anderson County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Routes 8 and 81, near White Plains in Anderson County, the Department acquired right of way for SC Routes 8 and 81 under the Beltline Acts of August 1920 and July 1936.

During acquisition negotiations for improvements to SC Routes 8 and 81 under File No. 4.2003, an agreement was made to convey to the adjoining property owner the abandoned portion of old SC Route 81. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.03 of an acre of land to Patricia R. Rogers and Sara S. Rogers was executed on December 11, 2006.

3. File 46.137A / SC Route 161 / York County / Fifth District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 161, under File No. 46.564, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-1115 by Right of Way Easements from Charles C. Love, Sr. and Bertha R. Love dated September 28, 1970, and from Sonny J. Kennington dated October 9, 1970, and by Condemnation of Perrine P. Harmon dated October 28, 1970.

A request was received from the adjacent landowners asking the Department to sell a parcel of possible surplus property. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.22 of an acre of land to Eugene A. Blackwell and Elizabeth A. Blackwell was executed on December 11, 2006, in consideration of \$10,750.00.



4. File 15.476 / Road S-717 / Colleton County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on Road S-717, under File 15.476 in Colleton County, in the City of Walterboro, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-717, by Condemnation of Harold L. Brossy dated August 31, 1977 and by Agreement with Seaboard Coast Line Railroad Company dated November 8, 1977.

During negotiations, the Department agreed to quitclaim a portion of Road S-717 to the Grantee because the Grantee relocated Road S-717 at no cost to the Department. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.87 of an acre of land to Jemsite Development, Inc. was executed on December 11, 2006.

5. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File 10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from Carolyn Lorraine Jenkins dated December 19, 2002.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcel to them. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.039 of an acre of land to the City of Charleston was executed on December 11, 2006.

6. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File 10.257A/10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from Lucille James dated July 26, 2003, and from Charles F. Tremann, Gretchen W. Tremann and Michael C. Tremann dated February 21, 2002.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcels known as 25 and 29 San Souci Street to the City of Charleston. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for 0.157 of an acre of land to the City of Charleston was executed on December 11, 2006.

7. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File No. 10.257A/10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from Eastside Baptist Church dated June 18, 2001, and from Jimmy Austin dated November 19, 1999.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcels known as 342 and 350 Nassau Street to the City of Charleston. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for 0.33 of an acre to the City of Charleston was executed on December 11, 2006.

8. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File No. 10.257A/10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from Beatrice W. Barnwell dated July 3, 2000.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcels known as E Street at the corner of C Street to the City of Charleston. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for 0.034 of an acre to the City of Charleston was executed on December 20, 2006.

9. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File No. 10.257A/10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from Grimbail and Lybrand Partnership, a SC General Partnership dated January 22, 2001.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcel known as the Catherine Sigwald House (74 Fishburne Street) to the City of Charleston. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for 0.110 of an acre to the City of Charleston was executed on December 11, 2006.

10. File 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17, under File No. 10.257A/10.432A in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17, by Title to Real Estate from 665 Meeting Street and Weil's Mattress Company dated August 7, 2001.

Pursuant to the Partnership Agreement between the City of Charleston and SCDOT, it was agreed to convey certain surplus parcels of land to the City of Charleston at the completion of the new Cooper River Bridge Project for community enhancement and mitigation. A request was received from the City of Charleston to convey the parcel known as the Charleston City Railway Car House (the Trolley Turn Shed/Bus Barn) and the Mattress Factory in the City of Charleston to the City of Charleston. Therefore, a gratis Quitclaim Deed for 2.809 acres to the City of Charleston was executed on December 20, 2006.

11. File 18.568 / Road S-199 / Dorchester County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 61 (now SC Route 165) under Project No. FAP 458, near the Town Summerville, in Dorchester County, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 165 by Condemnation of S. M. Boyle dated October 28, 1936. Also, during construction of improvements on Road S-199, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-199 under the Beltline Act, and under File No. 18.568, the Department acquired right of way from First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Charleston by Title to Real Estate dated January 30, 1998.

In the Department's efforts to liquidate its surplus inventory, the subject parcel was given to a real estate consultant. The property was marketed to the public with the Grantee making the highest offer, which was above appraised value. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.587 of an acre of land to Cool Breeze Properties, LLC was executed on December 11, 2006, in consideration of \$22,000.00.

12. File 39.674 / SC Route 93 / Pickens County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 93, under File 39.674 in Pickens County, in the City of Clemson, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 93, from Grace C. Manley by Condemnation dated May 15, 2000 (Tract 74); from Grace C. Manley by Condemnation dated May 15, 2000, (Tract 28); from Charles Clifford Fain by Title to Real Estate dated October 14, 1999 (Tract 73).

In the Department's efforts to liquidate its surplus inventory, the subject parcel was issued to a real estate consultant. The property was marketed to the public with the Grantee making the highest offer. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for 1.64 acres of land to Langley-Lenhardt Family Limited Partnership was executed on December 11, 2006, in consideration of \$360,000.00.

REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES FOR  
WIDENING OF US 76 (TIMMONSVILLE HWY) FROM I-95 TO AIRE ACRES  
ROAD IN FLORENCE COUNTY

(COMMISSION DISTRICT 6)

South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist SCDOT with the development of the widening of US 76 (Timmons ville Hwy) from I-95 to Aire Acres Road in Timmons ville. The four-mile widening project will also include a bridge replacement over Lake Swamp Creek. Based on current and projected workloads, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with developing the project within the required time frame.

This project will be funded entirely through a combination of Florence County's local option sales tax program funds and State Transportation Infrastructure Bank (STIB) funds.

South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist SCDOT with the development of the extension of SC Route 31 (Carolina Bays Parkway) from its existing terminus at SC Route 544 southeasterly to SC Route 707. The project will also include a bridge over the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway. Based on current and projected workloads, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with developing the project within the required time frame.

This project will be funded entirely through a combination of Horry County's local option sales tax funds and State Transportation Infrastructure Bank (STIB) funds.

REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES FOR THE  
DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW OVERPASS OVER US ROUTE 501 IN THE TOWN OF  
AYNOR IN HORRY COUNTY

(COMMISSION DISTRICT 1)

South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist SCDOT with the development of a new overpass over US Route 501 in the town of Aynor. The location of the overpass will be determined after alternate location studies have been performed. Based on current and projected workloads, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with developing the project within the required time frame.

This project will be funded entirely through a combination of Horry County's local option sales tax funds and State Transportation Infrastructure Bank (STIB) funds.

REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES FOR THE  
DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW INTERCHANGE AT SC ROUTE 707 AND US ROUTE  
17 BYPASS AT THE BACKGATE OF THE FORMER MYRTLE BEACH AIR  
FORCE BASE IN HORRY COUNTY

(COMMISSION DISTRICT 1)

South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering design services to assist SCDOT with the development of a new interchange at SC Route 707 and US Route 17 Bypass at the backgate of the former Myrtle Beach Air Force Base in Horry County. Based on current and projected workloads, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with developing the project within the required time frame.

This project will be funded predominantly through a combination of Horry County's local option sales tax funds and State Transportation Infrastructure Bank (STIB) funds. GSATS guideshares in the amount of \$1,000,000 have also been allocated for this project.

The South Carolina Department of Transportation requests Commission approval to solicit and negotiate professional services for the purpose of providing bridge maintenance services for the Ravenel Bridge and other selected bridges located in coastal counties.

The scope of services will consist of maintenance services, inspection services (inclusive of cable tension where applicable) and management of those services necessary to maintain selected bridges to State and Federal specifications. Maintenance required will vary based on bridge type and established maintenance manuals.

Based on special requirements for some of the bridges, the Department does not currently have the manpower and/or expertise necessary to ensure proper maintenance and specific warranties. Outsourcing bridge maintenance services for selected bridges will establish systematic and quality maintenance operations, and will ensure that contractor warranty specifications are supported.

US Route 17 (Ace Basin) – Phase I  
CE&I Services

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) is seeking qualified firms to provide project management and construction engineering and inspection (CEI) services for the US Route 17 (Ace Basin) – Phase I Design/Build Project in Beaufort County. The project consists of the following major activities:

- Final design of the US Route 17 Improvements from US Route 21 (Gardens Corner) to the Combahee River
- Right-of-Way services and acquisition for Phase I
- Construction of the US Route 17 widening for Phase I to include 3 bridges
- Construction of the multi-use path along the east side of US Route 17 from US Route 21 to Big Estate Road
- Construction on an interchange at US Route 17 and US Route 21

**EXTENSION OF BITUMINOUS RESURFACING CONTRACTS**

**TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL RESURFACING WORK**

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous contracts to include additional resurfacing work as follows:

**AIKEN COUNTY:** (Commissioner John N. Hardee)

Contract of Satterfield Construction Company, Inc. – File No. 2.170711 – extended to include resurfacing (File No. 2.170711) on S-933 from S-94 to SC 39 for 0.22 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 29,674.10

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of S-136 in this project.

This extension was authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

Recommendations: January 2007

**EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS**

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work as follows:

**PICKENS COUNTY:** (Commissioner Marion P. Carnell)

Contract of King Asphalt, Inc. – File No. 39.170710 & 39.2005.1 – extended to include additional sections of State Project MTN-MC07 & SMP-SMP5 (File No. 39.170710 & 39.2005.1) consisting of resurfacing on S-116 and S-232.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 63,813.75

**The Pickens County Transportation Committee has funded this extension.**

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

### **Removal of Roads From State Highway Secondary System**

The Department recommends Commission approval for the removal of certain sections of secondary roads from the State Highway Secondary System. These sections of roads may be removed for one of the following reasons:

1. Abandonment of Relocated Section of Highway
2. Deletions and Removal of Roads from State Secondary System - Roads may be deleted and removed from secondary system by exchanging for equal or less mileage or roads, which have a higher traffic importance. Ownership reverts to local government having jurisdiction (city or county). Approval of deletion or removal by local government is not required.
3. Abandonment of Right-of-way - Right-of-way may be abandoned if it is determined that the right-of-way is not required for right-of-way proposes or if the right-of-way is not needed for Department purposes.
4. Court Order

### **Correction of Description of State Highways**

The Department recommends Commission approval of the correction of the description of sections of State Highway previously added to the State Highway System. The description of roads currently in the State Highway Secondary System may be changed for relocation purposes, to revise the description of the termini to show what was actually constructed by contract, county line changes, or a change in the secondary road number.

### **Additions to State Highway Secondary System**

The Department recommends Commission approval to add sections of road to the State Highway Secondary System for construction and maintenance. The Department may add roads to the State Highway Secondary System by request of the County Transportation Committees contingent on mileage being available under the current mileage cap. Roads may be added to the State Secondary System by the construction of a new roadway, accepting existing county/city roads into our Secondary System by the swap method, or by county line changes. Roads added to the State Highway System must be constructed to Department standards or reviewed for compliance with Department standards.

### **Rescind Action Adding Roads to State Highway Secondary System**

The Department recommends the Commission rescind its previous actions adding roads to the State Highway Secondary System for construction and maintenance. The Department may rescind action on roads, which have not been constructed and formally accepted into the State Highway Secondary System. Roads may be rescinded due to right-of-way being unavailable, problems arising during construction, or funding issues.

### **Transfer of Road between Secondary and Primary Systems**

The Department recommends Commission approval to transfer sections of road from the Secondary System to the Primary System, or vice versa. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 57-5-50 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, 1976, the Commission may transfer any route or section of route from the state highway secondary system to the state highway primary system, or vice versa, when, in its judgment, such transfer is advisable to better serve the traveling public.



### **Current Policy** (adopted March 2006):

“SCDOT will provide the state match for congressional earmarks, which were approved and submitted by the Commission. A further motion was made that congressional earmarks, which were not submitted in accordance with the policy must be matched by the local government or entity that requested the earmark, unless the Commission determines on a case-by-case basis that the match should be provided by SCDOT.”

## MOTION TO AMEND BYLAWS TO PROVIDE THAT DIRECTOR OF AUDITS REPORTS DIRECTLY TO COMMISSION

The Personnel Committee makes a motion that the Commission Bylaws be amended to provide that the Director of Audits shall report to, be hired and fired by, and be evaluated by the Commission, in coordination with the Director of Human Resources. The proposed amendments are as follows:

Section 100, "General Powers" shall be amended as follows:

### SECTION 100. General Powers

The affairs of the Commission shall be managed under the direction of its members. It shall be a general policy making body for the various functions and purposes of the South Carolina Department of Transportation as prescribed by law. It and the Director shall govern the South Carolina Department of Transportation by the Commission defining policies which are to be administered by the Director. All other personnel of the Department, with the exception of the Director of Audits who shall report to, be hired and terminated by, and be evaluated by the Commission, in coordination with the Director of Human Resources, subject to grievance rights under State Employee Grievance Procedures, shall be appointed, promoted, disciplined or removed by the Director under a Merit System of Personnel Administration, job classifications and pay grades in accordance with the State Personnel and Classifications Plan and the State Employee Grievance Procedures; except that Code 57-1-450 provides that the Deputy Directors for each division serve at the pleasure of the Director and may receive compensation as established under the provisions of Code 8-11-64 and for which funds have been authorized in the general appropriations act. The Director shall conduct, execute and manage the day to day affairs of the Department and shall have all of the powers of the Commission it is not in session.

Section 110, "Powers and Duties of the Director," Paragraphs 4 and 6 shall be amended as follows:

### SECTION 110. Powers and Duties of the Director

4. The Director shall have the sole authority to employ and discharge Department employees, subject to such applicable laws, applicable personnel policies and funding available for that purpose, with the exception of the Director of Audits who shall be employed and discharged by the Commission.

6. The Director shall have general supervision over and direction of all other officers and employees of the Department, with the exception of the Director of Audits, and to see that their respective duties are properly performed.
