We should discuss the nuance before you get back to her, but broad strokes, I'd say that Deloitte didn't call for the creation of a new agency, and we supported their recommendations.

Also, her question is preconditioned on the idea that if S. 334 doesn't pass, then you can't have a cybersecurity official (Chief Information Security Officer) in place prior to July 2014. I think that if the bill doesn't make it this year, then the budget could be used to provide funding (likely through the Budget and Control Board) to get started on that work on July 1, 2013 anyway.
