MINUTES OF BUDGET AND CONTROL BOARD MEETING

MAY 2, 1978 3:30 P. M.

The Budget and Control Board met at 3:30 p.m. on May 2, 1978 in the Governor's Conference Room with the following members in attendance:

Governor James B. Edwards
Mr. Grady L. Patterson, Jr.
Representative Tom G. Mangum

Senator Dennis joined the meeting during the Executive Session portion. Mr. Earle E. Morris, Jr., was on National Guard duty.

Also attending were Board Secretary State Auditor William T. Putnam, Governor's Executive Assistant Walter R. Pettiss and his Assistant A. E. Reiser, State Planning Director P. C. Smith and Assistant State Auditor William A. McInnis.

The following items of business were considered:

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING - Board members previously had been furnished with a draft version of the minutes of the meeting held on April 19, 1978.

Upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, the referenced minutes were approved as written.

POLL AGENDA - Eleven items plus one supplemental item were included on the poll agenda for the present meeting. Mr. Putnam announced that Poll Item 2 (relating to a General Services Division request for capital improvement bond funds to purchase the Five Points building) and Poll Item 11 (relating to a communication from the Department of Archives and History relating to a proposed Columbia Canal/Congaree River Historic District) were to be considered during the regular session and that Poll Item 10 would be considered in Executive Session. Poll items are specifically identified as such in these minutes.

DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES - CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BOND FUNDS

REQUEST (POLL ITEM 1) - Division Director Furman McEachern reported that his Division has an average appraisal of \$1,225,000 for the SCN property located at Assembly and Pendleton Streets in Columbia. Mr. McEachern expressed the view that this is an acceptable price and within the value of the 50,000 gross square foot building with one and three-quarter acres of land.

Mr. McEachern requested that the Budget and Control Board recommend to the General Assembly that capital improvement bonds in the amount of \$2,000,000 be authorized for the purchase of the referenced property and for its renovation into quarters acceptable for State agency tenants.

The Budget and Control Board without objection approved Mr. McEachern's request and thereby agreed to recommend to the General Assembly that \$2,000,000 of capital improvement bonds be authorized for the purchase and renovation of the SCN property located at Assembly and Pendleton Streets in Columbia.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit I.

WILDLIFE AND MARINE RESOURCES DEPARTMENT - TRANSFER OF PROPERTY TO

HERITAGE TRUST (POLL ITEM 3) - Assistant Attorney General Frederick M. Zeigler advised the Budget and Control Board that the Nature Conservancy had donated a 138-acre tract of land in McCormick County (known as Stevens Creek) to the State of South Carolina with the understanding that this property be placed in the Heritage Preserve Program. Mr. Zeigler provided a document through which the Budget and Control Board, acting on behalf of the State, would carry out that understanding by transferring the title to this real estate to the Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission as trustee of the Heritage Preserve Program.

The Budget and Control Board without objection approved the transfer of the referenced property and executed the document conveying the title to this real estate to the Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission as trustee of the

referenced Program.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit II.

INDUSTRIAL REVENUE BONDS - SPARTANBURG COUNTY (POLL ITEM 4) - The Budget and Control Board was presented with a Petition from Spartanburg County for the issuance of \$1,400,000 Industrial Revenue Bonds on behalf of Community Cash Stores. The project involves the construction of warehousing and distribution facilities, and, when completed, will provide employment for about 20 persons.

After being assured that all legal documents pertaining to this issue had been reviewed by the Office of the Attorney General and that satisfactory financial information had been received and reviewed by the State Auditor's Office, the Budget and Control Board, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, adopted a Resolution approving the Spartanburg County proposal to issue \$1,400,000 Industrial Revenue Bonds on behalf of Community Cash Stores, pursuant to 1976 Code Sections 4-29-10 et seq.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit III.

DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES - QUIT-CLAIM DEED - CHARLESTON COUNTY - Division Director Furman McEachern advised the Budget and Control Board that a settlement has been negotiated in a legal action involving the Patriots Point Development Authority and the Sessions Estate and that, as a part of the settlement, the Authority will execute a deed to the Sessions Estate. Mr. McEachern also reported that the Sessions Estate desires to obtain a quit-claim deed from the Budget and Control Board involving this same property.

Mr. McEachern, after noting that the Attorney General's Office has concurred in this action, recommended that the Board approve and execute the referenced quit-claim deed.

The Budget and Control Board without objection approved the referenced recommendation by Mr. McEachern and executed the referenced quit-claim deed.

A copy of the executed deed has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit IV.

DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES - AIKEN MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY (POLL ITEM 6) - The Division of General Services reported that, after inspecting the building which the Board at its 4/19/78 meeting authorized it to acquire for the Aiken Mental Health Board, the Division now believes the acquisition of this property would not be in the best interest of the State. The Division also advised that the Department of Mental Health and the owners of the property have been advised that negotiations are being discontinued.

This report by the Division of General Services was received as information by the Budget and Control Board.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit V.

PUBLIC RAILWAYS COMMISSION - UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (POLL ITEM 7) - Public Railways Commission Executive Director W. J. Betz called the Board's attention to a situation faced by his Commission which would require, if relief is not granted, participation in the unemployment insurance program sponsored by the Railroad Retirement Board (which is required of the Commission under Federal statute) and in the State Unemployment Compensation Program.

State Auditor Putnam requested Board authorization to work with the Public Railways Commission so as to avoid this duplication of coverage and the associated costs.

The Budget and Control Board without objection approved Mr. Putnam's request and authorized him to work with the Public Railways Commission so as to avoid the referenced duplication.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit VI.

CONSULTANT SERVICES CONTRACTS (POLL ITEM 8) - The Budget and Control Board without objection approved the following consultant services contracts:

Purpose: for the implementation of the West Virginia Long Term Care rate-setting
system.

(4) Wildlife and Marine Resources: Consultant: Infonet Systems,
Inc.; Maximum Dollars \$11,250, magazine revenue; Time Period: 12 months after

ADDITIONAL POSITIONS (POLL ITEM 9) - The Budget and Control Board
without objection approved the following: (1) State-funded positions above the
number authorized: (a) Judicial Department: 1 Legal Secretary II and 1 adminis-
trative Services Manager; and (b) Department of Corrections: 1 Security Officer;
and (2) Additional positions funded from other sources: (a) Department of
Corrections: 1 Chief, Industries Production and 1 Chief, Industries Marketing.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files
and is identified as Exhibit VIII.

CLEMSON UNIVERSITY - REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION OF TRAVEL ADVANCE
EXEMPTION (POLL ITEM SUPPLEMENTAL 1) - Clemson University requested that the

Budget and Control Board reconsider its previous denial of a Clemson request for an exemption from certain of the Travel Advance Regulations adopted by the Board on 9/23/77.

Following a brief discussion, the Budget and Control Board agreed that it would not reconsider the Clemson request.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit IX.

DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES - CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BOND REQUEST

(FIVE POINTS BUILDING) - Division Director Furman McEachern proposed (in Poll Item 2) that the Board recommend to the General Assembly that \$2,375,000 be authorized in order that the option to purchase the property at 2221 Devine Street might be exercised prior to 12/1/78.

Board members expressed the view that this possibility had been considered in connection with the Board's recommendations on capital improvement bonds and that it had been decided at that time not to recommend this authorization this year. Governor Edwards emphasized that, because of the very favorable agreement the State had entered into with respect to this property, the Board should stay with the original agreement which provides for a five-year period during which the State might exercise the purchase option and during which period the purchase price would increase by \$25,000 annually above \$2,325,000.

Following this discussion, the Budget and Control Board without objection agreed to continue for the present time the lease/purchase option agreement covering the property at 2221 Devine Street and thereby chose not to recommend the bond authorization requested by Mr. McEachern.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit X.

ARCHIVES AND HISTORY - PROPOSED HISTORIC DISTRICT - This matter (which had been included as Poll Item 11) related to a communication from Dr. Charles E. Lee, Director of the Department of Archives and History, to the Highway Department

on the subject of the proposed establishment of a Columbia Canal/Congaree River Historic District. Governor's Executive Assistant Walter Pettiss pointed out that this matter had been brought to the attention of the Board because the Division of General Services, Water Resources Commission and the Land Resources Conservation Commission were not aware of this undertaking. General Services Director McEachern pointed out that the property owned by the State of South Carolina and located within the proposed district is under the control of the Budget and Control Board rather than the Highway Department as Dr. Lee noted in his letter.

The Budget and Control Board received as information the report on the proposed District as described by Dr. Lee.

Information pertaining to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit XI.

FUNDS FOR ASHLEY SQUARE RENTAL - State Auditor Putnam called the Board's attention to some uncertainties relating to the Board's April 5, 1978 action on the question of the occupancy of and the funding for the space in Ashley Square for which the State is obligated. He pointed out that it was understood that certain State agencies which desired space in the Ashley Square property also would have the funds available to enable them to do so but that the minutes of the April 5 meeting do not clearly reflect the idea that first priority on the five floors of the Ashley Square property for which the State is obligated would be given to such other agencies and that the Medical University would be assigned whatever space remained within the five floors after such other agencies are accommodated.

Governor Edwards expressed the view that these other agencies which have the necessary funds should be given first priority on the Ashley Square space for which the State is obligated and that the Medical University would get whatever balance of the State's obligation is not taken by such agencies.

Budget and Control Board members agreed that the Board's request for additional funding to meet the State's five-floor obligation in the Ashley

Square property should cover the entire five floors but that those agencies for which rental funds will be available should pay their own rentals as a reimbursement.

Mr. Putnam stated that the cleanest way to handle the problem is to identify the space requirements of those other agencies desiring space in the Ashley Square property and which have the necessary funds and then to advise the Medical University that it will be assigned whatever balance of the five-floor obligation of the State may remain.

Mr. Putnam advised the Board that the minutes of the April 5, 1978 meeting pertaining to the Ashley Square situation would be modified so as to reflect the concept of giving priority to other agencies which will have the rental funds required and assigning to the Medical University such space as may remain after accommodating these other agencies.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES - POSITIONS FUNDED BY CETA AND PSE -

At its April 19, 1978 meeting, the Budget and Control Board approved nine additional positions (four for Darlington County and five for Sumter County) on the condition that no State liability for unemployment compensation or other benefits is involved. At the present meeting, Mr. Walter Pettiss reported that the Department of Social Services insists that these nine additional positions be added to the State payroll rather than to the two county payrolls and recommended that these additional positions be approved for employment by the respective counties or that the funds made available through the Governor's Office be allocated elsewhere.

Following a brief discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, the Budget and Control Board disapproved the addition of these nine positions to the State payroll and approved Mr. Pettiss' recommendation that they be hired at the county level.

The Budget and Control Board, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, adopted this position as a policy for application in similar situations in the future.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit XII.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS REVIEW SUBCOMMITTEE - GRANT AND CONTRACT REQUESTS -

State Auditor Putnam, accompanied by Grants Services Administrator George F. Oliver, called the Board's attention to the two conditional approval recommendations included in the subcommittee's package of 68 projects involving a total of \$60,015,689 of which \$57,739,484 are federal funds, \$1,802,164 are state funds, and \$474,041 are other funds.

Following a brief discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, the Budget and Control Board approved the recommendations of the Grants and Contracts Review Subcommittee relating to the 68 requests presented.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit XIII.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS REVIEW UNIT - COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON NSF AWARD -

State Auditor Putnam advised the Board that a College of Charleston request for an instructional program grant from the National Science Foundation, which the Board disapproved on 12/22/77 because the proposal violated the indirect cost recovery policy, has been funded by the NSF with the budget renegotiated so as to include \$5,638 of indirect costs for return to the General Fund.

Following a brief discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, the Budget and Control Board reconsidered its original disapproval and, on the grounds that the original objection had been eliminated, approved the referenced request.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit XIV.

FINANCE DIVISION - SECTION 147 VACANCY TERMINATION PROCEDURE - State

Auditor Putnam quoted Paragraph No. 3 of Section 147 relating to the requirement that positions remaining unfilled for more than 12 months are to be declared non-essential and terminated and that funds generated from such terminations are

to be returned to the General Fund. He reported that the Finance Division and the State Personnel Division have been working on this matter and have identified numerous vacancies which are apparently subject to the referenced requirement. Mr. Putnam indicated that the agencies involved had been notified but that, in most cases, the agencies have expressed a desire to retain the positions. Mr. Putnam also expressed the view that if these vacancies are terminated the agencies in many cases would make requests to reestablish them. Mr. Putnam and Dr. Mullins agreed that, under the law, there is no choice but to terminate any position which has remained vacant for more than 12 months.

The Budget and Control Board agreed that there is no choice but to carry out the provisions of the law in this regard.

Mr. Putnam reminded the Board that by previous action of the General Assembly personal services appropriations had been reduced by two percent but that the number of positions had not been adjusted to reflect this reduction. Mr. Putnam indicated that the understanding at the time the two percent reduction of personal services funds was made was that the agencies would be allowed to manage their respective personal services situations so as to cover the two percent reduction and recommended that the positions identified as having been vacant for 12 months or more be terminated but that the funds associated with these positions not be seized at this time. Mr. Putnam stressed that the only reason not to seize any such funds at the time the positions are terminated is the prior understanding relating to the two percent personal services appropriation reduction. He also indicated that this approach would require that a determination be made that the funds are available in each case where a request is made to reestablish any of the positions terminated.

Governor Edwards called attention to Paragraph No. 5 of Section 147 relating to a requirement that the Budget and Control Board in cooperation with the Reorganization Commission devise a formal plan for the permanent control and supervision over the number of state employees and expressed concern that a formal plan has not yet been developed. Mr. Putnam indicated that a special

report is being generated monthly by the State Personnel Division and that conversations with the Reorganization Commission on this matter have been held. He also expressed the view that the Central Payroll/Personnel System would eventually meet this requirement.

Information relating to these matters has been retained in these files and is identified as Exhibit XV.

FINANCE DIVISION (STATE ENGINEER) - BUILDING CODE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENTS

AND APPEALS - The Budget and Control Board in a previous action adopted the Standard Building Code which provides for a Board of Adjustments and Appeals but no such board has been established. The Standard Building Code provides that this board consist of five members as follows: one architect, one general contractor or engineer, and three members at large from the building industry. The function of this board is to hear and decide appeals of decisions made by the "building official" who, in the framework of the state government, is the State Engineer.

State Engineer John McPherson has requested that the Budget and Control Board consider activating a Building Code Board of Adjustments and Appeals and, if activated, Mr. McPherson recommended that the following persons be named to serve on that board: Mr. Robert B. Cannon, Jr., Architect; Mr. Robert A. Coleman, Engineer; and, from the building industry at large, Mr. Raymond S. Soubeyroux, Mr. Nelson W. Meek and Mr. J. Curt Gwinn.

Following a brief discussion in which it was emphasized that the Building Code Board of Adjustments and Appeals would be concerned with hearing and deciding any appeals of decisions made by the State Engineer in the administration of the Standard Building Code in connection with construction of state-owned buildings, upon a motion by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Representative Mangum, the Budget and Control Board agreed to establish a Building Code Board of Adjustments and Appeals and approved the appointment of the membership as recommended by State Engineer McPherson.

Information relating to this matter has been retained in these files

and is identified as Exhibit XVI.

FUTURE MEETINGS - The Budget and Control Board agreed to hold its next meetings on Tuesday, May 9, 1978, at 3:30 p.m. and on Tuesday, May 23, 1978, at 4:00 p.m. in the Governor's Conference Room.

EXECUTIVE SESSION - State Auditor Putnam announced that four contractual matters, one briefing on a court suit and one dual employment item had been proposed for consideration in Executive Session. Mr. Putnam also announced that the Legislative Audit Council had requested permission for Mr. John M. Cooper, Assistant Analyst/Auditor with the Audit Council, to observe the Board's consideration of several architectural and engineering contractual matters during the Executive Session. Board members expressed no objection and Governor Edwards welcomed Mr. Cooper.

The Budget and Control Board then without objection agreed to consider the matters outlined by Mr. Putnam whereupon Governor Edwards declared the meeting to be in Executive Session.

RATIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE SESSION ACTIONS - Following the Board's consideration of Executive Session items, the meeting was opened and the following actions taken by the Board in Executive Session were ratified without objection:

- (1) Carried over for further consideration, pending receipt of additional information, approval of the selection of two architectural and engineering firms;
- (2) Approved, by correcting a technical error, the extension of an existing architectural and engineering contract between the Patriots Point Development Authority and E. M. Seabrook, Jr., Inc., (prime professional), subject to the approval of the Attorney General's Office;
- (3) Approved a special dual employment payment requested by the Department of Agriculture;
- (4) Heard a briefing on a possible settlement of a pending legal action; and

(5) Received as information a briefing on renewal rates for health insurance for State and Public School employees.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:20 p.m.

I. Request for Permanent Improvement Bonds

- A. We have an average appraisal of \$1,225,000 for the SCN Building located at Assembly and Pendleton Streets. This is an acceptable price and within the value of the 50,000 gross sq. ft. building with one and three-quarter acres of land. It is particularly needed to relieve pressure on the Hampton Building and to provide space for the Financial Division, the State Treasurer, and others situated there.

It is requested that the Board recommend to the General Assembly a bond issue of \$2 million for purchase of the property and for renovation into quarters acceptable for state agency tenants.

- B. Under the terms of Option Agreement dated November 22, 1976, the State has the option to purchase the property at 2221 Devine Street at the present time for \$2,375,000. It is recommended that Capital Improvement bonds be approved in this amount so that the option may be exercised prior to December 1, 1978.

II. Department of Mental Health--Aiken (For information)

At the meeting April 19 the Budget and Control Board approved the Division of General Services and Mental Health Commission negotiating for the purchase of the building now occupied by the Aiken Mental Health Department. We have had this building inspected by our engineering and property management staff and find that the acquisition of this property would not be in the best interest of the State. We have advised the Department of Mental Health of our recommendation that negotiations be discontinued and the present owners be notified of this action.

III. Quit-Claim Deed--Charleston County

A settlement has been negotiated in a legal action involving the Patriots Point Authority and the Sessions Estate. As a part of the settlement the Patriots Point Authority will execute a deed to the Sessions Estate. The Sessions Estate wishes to obtain a Quit-Claim deed from the Budget and Control Board involving the same property. With the concurrence of the Attorney General, I recommend that the Budget and Control Board execute the said Quit-Claim deed.





NOW KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the State of South Carolina, in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) to it paid, at and before the sealing of these presents by the South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission and as provided for and in compliance with Act 600 of the 1976 Joint Acts and Resolutions has granted, bargained, sold, and released and by these Presents does grant, bargain, sell, and release unto the said SOUTH CAROLINA WILDLIFE AND MARINE RESOURCES COMMISSION, as TRUSTEE, its successors and assigns the following described property subject to the hereinafter denoted terms:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, containing one hundred thirty-eight and seven-tenths (138.7) acres, more or less, situate, lying and being in McCormick County, South Carolina, and being more particularly shown and delineated on a plat of survey thereof made by H. M. Brown, R.L.S., dated July 23, 1976, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and recorded in the office of the Clerk of Court for McCormick County, South Carolina, in Plat Book 9, Page 45; said tract has such metes, courses and distances as will more fully appear on said plat and is bounded as follows: North by property now or formerly of Glen Bussey and by property of The Continental Group, Inc., being divided therefrom by Stevens Creek, being the boundary line between McCormick and Edgefield Counties; East by property now or formerly of George Buchanan; South by property of the Continental Group, Inc., being separated therefrom by a paved public road, S-143; and West by property now or formerly of L. T. Anderson; being a portion of the property conveyed to Continental Can Company, Inc., now The

Continental Group, Inc., by R. T. THE COMMISSION, as Trustee, shall hold the property in trust subject to the following terms and restrictions:

1. The essential natural character of the property shall be maintained.
2. There shall be no erection of any improvements thereon except those minimal improvements necessary for the security, safety or convenience of the public and those required for maintenance and management.
3. Cutting or burning of timber, wood or other destruction of flora or fauna shall be permitted only for the conservation or regeneration of flora or fauna; or for the control of plant succession by deliberate manipulation for restoration of preservation of a particular vegetation type or of an endangered species of flora, fauna or wildlife; or for the establishment and maintenance of nature and hiking trails, camping areas and the like where compatible and consistent with the character of the area or feature concerned and not seriously damaging or detrimental to the natural quality of the property.
4. No stream shall be dammed or have its course altered.
5. No motorized vehicles shall be permitted on the property other than those utilized by the trustee or its agents in management and protection of the property or used by the general public for ingress and egress to the property in compliance with the management plan for the area or feature concerned.
6. No change shall be made in the general topography of the area or feature except for those minimal alterations which may be necessary to provide on-foot access to the public for visitation, or observation; and this shall be done only where wholly compatible and consistent with the character of the property and where no detrimental effect shall result.
7. No activity shall be allowed or permitted which might pollute any stream, body of water, or the atmosphere.
8. No signs, billboards or other advertising of any kind shall be erected; however, informational and directional signs related to the designation of the area or feature as a Heritage Preserve and related to the public's enjoyment thereof

shall be allowed when approved by the trustee.

9. No other acts or uses which are detrimental to the retention of the property in its natural state shall be allowed, including those detrimental to flood control, drainage, water conservation, erosion control or soil conservation, or fish or wildlife habitat preservation.
10. The trust shall continue in perpetuity.

FURTHER, the property shall be managed by the TRUSTEE as set forth in the Dedication Agreement filed in the RMC Office of McCormick County in Deed Book 45, Page 46.

THE following use of regulations and restrictions run with the land and are applicable to the Trustee:

1. Purpose: The Trustee shall maintain the property solely as a Natural Area for scientific, educational, and aesthetic purposes. There shall be no commercial development or exploitation of the property.
2. Improvements: Existing buildings, roads, and other improvements on the property may be maintained or replaced, but such existing buildings, roads, and other improvements may not be expanded, enlarged, or the like, and no additional buildings, roads, or other improvements may be constructed thereon by the Trustee or by any other party without the prior written approval of The Nature Conservancy.
3. Noxious Substances: There shall be no spraying or use of pesticides, herbicides, or other biocides or noxious substances on the property without the prior written approval of The Nature Conservancy.
4. Motorized Access: There shall be no operation of snowmobiles, dune buggies, motorcycles, all-terrain vehicles or other loud or offensive motorized vehicles on the property with the exception of official vehicles of the Trustee.
5. Lease: The Trustee shall not lease the property nor any part thereof without, in any such case, obtaining the prior written consent of The Nature Conservancy. The Trustee shall not permit any transfer, by operation of law or otherwise, of the interest in the property acquired by it under the terms of this conveyance.
6. Hunting and Fishing: No hunting or fishing or other removal or disturbance of flora and fauna shall be permitted except in those cases where it is deemed necessary in order to regulate certain wildlife populations on the property, and then only with the prior written approval of The Nature Conservancy.
7. Alterations: The Trustee shall not excavate, dredge, ditch, dike, quarry, or remove loam, sand, shells, silt, gravel, peat, mud or other soil substrate or mineral, oil, or gas, nor shall it cut, trim, or remove timber or other flora or parts thereof, including but not limited to the taking of logs or of boughs or limbs without the prior written approval of The Nature Conservancy. However, the Trustee shall make arrangements to protect the area from wildfire including the construction of firebreaks.

8. Use: The Trustee's use and management of the property and the public's access to and use of such premises shall be limited so as not to disturb in any way the presently existing ecosystems. The specific limitations on use shall be determined by reference to a Use Plan, as referred to immediately below. Scientific and educational use of the property shall receive highest priority.

TOGETHER with all and singular, the Rights, Members Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the said Premises beforementioned unto the said South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission, as Trustee, its Successors and Assigns forever, subject to the hereinabove denoted terms and restrictions.



We recommend that every conceivable effort be made to protect the flora and fauna of the property and agree with the present management policy as stated in your plan.

We believe that this program can best achieve the purpose of providing long term protection for the area as well as providing for regulated use and research on the site.

USE PLAN

The STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA shall manage the property in accordance with a plan of proposed use and management ("Use Plan"), which it shall prepare and submit to THE NATURE CONSERVANCY for its review and approval.

SOUTH CAROLINA HERITAGE TRUST

The GRANTOR recognizes that the STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA has developed a Heritage Trust Program that will afford additional protection and special management considerations to the property. The GRANTOR reserves the right to request and require that all or any part of the property be dedicated to, included in, added to, or made a part of the South Carolina Heritage Trust Program.

ENFORCEMENT

The GRANTOR hereby reserves to its employees and to its successors and assigns the right to enter onto the property for the purposes of exercising its rights generally to see to and protect its interest as provided for hereunder.

EXCEPTIONS

The GRANTOR may authorize, in writing, exceptions to the above-stated conditions and covenants, in its sole discretion, for reasons of protection of humans from loss of life or bodily injury, for scientific and educational experimentation, or for other purposes, provided that the essential natural character of the property is not impaired.

REVERTER

Should the premises cease to be used solely as provided herein, then the estate hereby granted to the State of South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Department may be terminated by THE NATURE CONSERVANCY under a power of termination in the nature of right of entry for condition broken or executory interest, which right, if exercised by THE NATURE CONSERVANCY, upon violation of the above conditions, is exercised by mailing a notice of violation by certified mail to the GRANTEE, its successors or assigns. Said notice shall declare that the power of termination has been exercised and shall state the breach which caused the action. A copy of the notice shall simultaneously be recorded on the appropriate land records.

PLAQUE LANGUAGE

As part consideration for this deed and by acceptance thereof the GRANTEE agrees to erect and maintain a permanent plaque or other appropriate marker at a prominent location on the above described premises bearing the following statement: "This area was acquired with the assistance of THE NATURE CONSERVANCY."

This is an acceptable price and within the value of the 50,000 gross sq. ft. building with one and three-quarter acres of land. It is particularly needed to relieve pressure on the Hampton Building and to provide space for the Financial Division, the State Treasurer, and others situated there.

It is requested that the Board recommend to the General Assembly a bond issue of \$2 million for purchase of the property and for renovation into quarters acceptable for state agency tenants.

- B. Under the terms of Option Agreement dated November 22, 1976, the State has the option to purchase the property at 2221 Devine Street at the present time for \$2,375,000. It is recommended that Capital Improvement bonds be approved in this amount so that the option may be exercised prior to December 1, 1978.

II. Department of Mental Health--Aiken (For information)

At the meeting April 19 the Budget and Control Board approved the Division of General Services and Mental Health Commission negotiating for the purchase of the building now occupied by the Aiken Mental Health Department. We have had this building inspected by our engineering and property management staff and find that the acquisition of this property would not be in the best interest of the State. We have advised the Department of Mental Health of our recommendation that negotiations be discontinued and the present owners be notified of this action.

→ III. Quit-Claim Deed--Charleston County

A settlement has been negotiated in a legal action involving the Patriots Point Authority and the Sessions Estate. As a part of the settlement the Patriots Point Authority will execute a deed to the Sessions Estate. The Sessions Estate wishes to obtain a Quit-Claim deed from the Budget and Control Board involving the same property. With the concurrence of the Attorney General, I recommend that the Budget and Control Board execute the said Quit-Claim deed.







RE: Proposed Guidelines - Travel Advances

Dear Mr. Putnam:

The Department of Corrections has, in the past, made travel advances to security personnel that would not have been in accordance with the new guidelines for this type transaction. Historically, this has been the only travel advance the Agency would allow (security personnel). The circumstances under which we would advance travel are those which involve security escort of inmates to and from other states and for hospitalization. Quite often, we must provide around-the-clock security for inmates hospitalized outside the Agency hospital and this requires, in most cases, an officer being away from home several days or longer. It is difficult for security personnel with their rate of pay to carry this out-of-pocket expense for two or three weeks. To continue as we have in the past, without authorization from the Budget and Control Board, would place us in violation of the published policy in Categories 1, 2 and 3.

In view of the inherent peculiarities of the security officers' duty and the rate of pay earned, we respectfully request that the Department of Corrections be allowed an exemption from the travel advance policy. I would like to make it clearly understood that this exemption would apply only to line officer security.

We recently received a document entitled "Travel Expense Advances" which provided policies and procedures for the implementation of Section 131 of the General Appropriation Act for 1977-78 which pertain to advancement of travel and subsistence expense monies. After reading these policies and procedures we find that there are several differences in those presently being used by Clemson University and the ones promulgated by the document referred to above.

In view of the fact that Clemson University's employees advance fund does not use any State funds at all but was made possible by gifts from Clemson University's Alumni Loyalty Fund and in view of the unusual circumstances of Clemson's Extension Service employees traveling continually, there are provisions in our policies and procedures which are very important and necessary.

INSTRUCTIONS AND PROCEDURES

1. All travel advances will be made at the Bursar's Office. Individual performing the travel must be the recipient of the cash advance.
2. The Employee's Advance Fund shall not be permitted to have a negative cash balance. Any Request for Official Travel Cash Advance presented at the Bursar's Office that would, if processed, cause an overdraft balance will be stamped 'Insufficient Funds' and returned to the employee.
3. Travel advances must be repaid within thirty days from the return date shown on the Request for Official Travel Cash Advance form. Any person having an unpaid travel advance which is "aged" more than thirty days from the return date, shall be automatically ineligible for an additional cash advance.
4. No travel advance shall be for more than 80% of the estimated amount of the travel expense reimbursement voucher (excluding plane fare). Normally, the 80% will be computed on the maximums provided for reimbursement of meals and lodging expense.
5. The minimum amount of a travel cash advance shall be \$35.00. To be eligible for the minimum amount, at least one night's lodging during the "in travel status" period is required.
6. No travel advance shall be for more than \$250.00.

SUBJECT : Travel Expense Advances

1. Reference: Budget and Control Board Instructions on Travel
Expense Advances (23 Sept 77).

2. Section 131 of the General Appropriation Act for 1977-78, concerning
this matter, is a positive action designed to solve a long-standing problem.
The implementing regulations, however, as outlined in referenced memorandum,
are considered unduly restrictive in several respects.


3. The Citadel budgets for and authorizes only that travel considered
essential to the mission of the college. Further, such travel is relatively
short-term in nature. Our present travel voucher and payment procedures are
designed to ensure proper accounting of all travel funds. Therefore, the monies
used for travel advances can be applied on a current basis against travel already
accomplished or, if an advance was in excess to the expenses incurred on a
particular trip, the excess can be promptly recouped. The arbitrary limitations
established in referenced regulation serve no useful purpose insofar as The
Citadel is concerned in this agency's use of its own funds.

4. From a practical point of view, the regulations adversely affect
those activities which require the most extended travel, both in-state and
externally, by the lowest-paid personnel: student recruiters and athletic
department coaches. These individuals are on the road sometimes for 7-10
consecutive days, on authorized college business, encumbering travel funds
included in their respective activity budgets.

5. There may be overriding reasons at the State level why such a
regulation is necessary. Therefore, request authority to establish a revolving
fund of \$5,000 for use, after proper authorization by this office, as travel
expense advances for Citadel personnel. Further, request that we be provided
at the earliest opportunity the travel advance form current under preparation,
so that our procedures can be uniformly administered.

I. Request for Permanent Improvement Bonds

- A. We have an average appraisal of \$1,225,000 for the SCN Building located at Assembly and Pendleton Streets. This is an acceptable price and within the value of the 50,000 gross sq. ft. building with one and three-quarter acres of land. It is particularly needed to relieve pressure on the Hampton Building and to provide space for the Financial Division, the State Treasurer, and others situated there.

It is requested that the Board recommend to the General Assembly a bond issue of \$2 million for purchase of the property and for renovation into quarters acceptable for state agency tenants.

- B. Under the terms of Option Agreement dated November 22, 1976, the State has the option to purchase the property at 2221 Devine Street at the present time for \$2,375,000. It is recommended that Capital Improvement bonds be approved in this amount so that the option may be exercised prior to December 1, 1978.

II. Department of Mental Health--Aiken (For information)

At the meeting April 19 the Budget and Control Board approved the Division of General Services and Mental Health Commission negotiating for the purchase of the building now occupied by the Aiken Mental Health Department. We have had this building inspected by our engineering and property management staff and find that the acquisition of this property would not be in the best interest of the State. We have advised the Department of Mental Health of our recommendation that negotiations be discontinued and the present owners be notified of this action.

III. Quit-Claim Deed--Charleston County

A settlement has been negotiated in a legal action involving the Patriots Point Authority and the Sessions Estate. As a part of the settlement the Patriots Point Authority will execute a deed to the Sessions Estate. The Sessions Estate wishes to obtain a Quit-Claim deed from the Budget and Control Board involving the same property. With the concurrence of the Attorney General, I recommend that the Budget and Control Board execute the said Quit-Claim deed.

OPTION AGREEMENT

OPTION granted this 22 day of November, 1976, by Bankers Trust of South Carolina (hereinafter referred to as "Optionor") to The State of South Carolina (hereinafter referred to as "Optionee").

IN CONSIDERATION of the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars paid by Optionee to Optionor, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and the covenants hereinafter contained:

1. The Optionor does hereby grant to the Optionee the exclusive option to purchase upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the property described in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. This option to purchase may be exercised by the Optionee at any time within five (5) years from the date hereof by notice in writing to the Optionor addressed to the attention of John T. Weeks, Vice Chairman and Secretary Executive, Bankers Trust of South Carolina, Post Office Box 448, Columbia, South Carolina, 29202. If not exercised within this time period it shall expire on November 21, 1981.

3. In the event of the failure of the Optionee to exercise this option or in the event of any default by the Optionee after the exercise of this option, all money paid by the Optionee to the Optionor upon the execution of this agreement shall be retained by the Optionor as consideration for the granting of this option to the Optionee and all rights of the Optionee under this agreement shall terminate.

4. The purchase price for the property described in Exhibit A hereto shall be as follows:

\$ 2,350,000 if said option is exercised in the first year hereof;	11/21/77
2,375,000 if said option is exercised in the second year hereof;	78
2,400,000 if said option is exercised in the third year hereof;	79
2,425,000 if said option is exercised in the fourth year hereof;	80
2,450,000 if said option is exercised in the fifth year hereof.	81

5. The closing under this agreement shall be in the offices of Optionor, Post Office Box 448, Columbia, South Carolina, 29202, no later than thirty (30) days after the Optionee's exercise of this option as provided in paragraph two above. If the thirtieth day falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the closing shall take place on the following business day. Payment shall be in cash or on such other terms as may be mutually agreed upon by Optionor and Optionee.

6. At the closing, the Optionor shall convey the property described in Exhibit A hereto to Optionee or to such state agency as Optionee desires by good and sufficient warranty deed free and clear of all encumbrances except those specifically assumed by the Optionee.

7. It shall be the Optionee's obligation to pay for any title examination and any fees required for the recording of the deed. The Optionor shall pay for documentary stamps required on the deed. All taxes, insurance, water rent, sewer charges, fuel, utilities and tenant rents shall be adjusted and prorated as of the date of closing.

8. This option may not be assigned by the Optionee without the prior written consent of Optionor.

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Lease Agreement made and entered into this 22 day of November, 1976, by and between BANKERS TRUST OF SOUTH CAROLINA, hereinafter called "Landlord," and THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, by its authorized Agency, hereinafter called "Tenant."

WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties agree for themselves, their successors and assigns, as follows:

Article I - Demised Premises

(a) Landlord hereby leases to the Tenant and the Tenant hereby rents from the Landlord all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, together with improvements thereon, more particularly described in Exhibit A hereto, together with all of the furniture, furnishings, materials, fixtures and equipment as may be owned by Landlord with respect to the demised premises and either located thereon or stored off premises by Landlord.

(b) Except as set out in I(c) and (d), at the commencement of the term, the Tenant shall accept the demised premises, together with the improvements thereon and any furniture, furnishings, fixtures, materials and equipment leased under I(a) "as is" and in their existing condition. No representation, statement or warranty, express or implied, has been made by or on behalf of the Landlord as to such condition, or as to the use that may be made of such property and Tenant accepts same without representation or warranty, express or implied, in fact or by law, and without recourse to the Landlord as to the nature, condition or liability thereof, or the uses to which the leased property may be put.

(c) The Tenant does not waive any rights it may have against the general contractor or any subcontractor under guarantees or warranties with respect to equipment or defects that now exist or may hereafter occur as a result of faults in materials and workmanship in the original construction of the leased property.

(d) The Landlord represents that it owns the leased property in fee simple and that the property is free from encumbrances except as referred to elsewhere in this lease. The Landlord further represents that it has the right to make this lease and covenants that it will execute or procure any further necessary assurances of title that may reasonably be required for the protection of the Tenant. The Landlord further represents that there will be no existing licensing agreements or service contracts with respect to janitorial service, maintenance, property management or otherwise with respect to the demised premises as of December 1, 1976. Landlord agrees to assume liability of any claims which may arise after December 1, 1976 as to any such agreements existing or entered into prior to December 1, 1976.

(e) This lease is given and accepted subject to the leases, rights, and privileges of tenants in possession, more particularly set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein, and the existence of such leases, rights, and privileges shall not be deemed a violation of the Landlord's covenant of quiet enjoyment or any other covenant in this lease. The Tenant hereby assumes all responsibility as landlord effective December 1, 1976 by reason of such leases and the rights of such tenants, and Tenant is hereby entitled from December 1, 1976 to all rents, additional rents, and other amounts due from such tenants, together with the security deposits listed in Exhibit B. To the extent any rents have been waived or delayed by Landlord under the terms of any of the leases listed on Exhibit B, Landlord agrees to pay the difference to Tenant until the normal lease schedules commence on these leases. The

Tenant shall be allowed to enforce all rights, remedies, and privileges of the Landlord under the terms of the leases listed in Exhibit B until the expiration of such leases or the sooner termination of this lease. Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties hereto, any real estate taxes, utility payments, assessments, water charges, and sewer charges due from tenants shall be apportioned as of December 1, 1976 so that Landlord will receive those attributable to the period of time before December 1, 1976 and Tenant will receive all thereafter.

Article II - Term

This lease shall be for a five (5) year term commencing December 1, 1976.

Article III - Rental

Tenant shall pay to the Landlord for the use and occupancy of the demised premises rental as hereinafter provided.

1. Net Rent. Tenant shall pay net annual rent of \$120,000 due and payable at \$10,000 per month on the first of each month commencing December 1, 1976.

2. Payment of Expenses by Tenant. In addition to the above, Tenant will pay all expenses as additional rent in the operation of the demised premises, including the following charges:

(a) All utility, sewage and water charges as described in Article VII;

(b) Taxes and assessments as described in Article VI.

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, any charges or payments due under this Article III shall be pro-rated or apportioned as of December 1, 1976 so that Landlord will pay those charges to this date and Tenant will pay those charges thereafter.

Article IV - Alterations and Improvements

Subject to Article IX, Tenant shall have the right, from time to time, to make all such alterations and improvements to, and decoration of, the interior of the leased property as shall be reasonably necessary or appropriate in the Tenant's judgment for the Tenant's conduct thereon of its business. All alterations, decorations, additions, and improvements, except movable trade fixtures, shall become the property of the Landlord.

Article V - Repairs and Maintenance

The Tenant shall, at its own expense, make all necessary repairs and replacements to the leased property and to the pipes, heating and cooling system, plumbing system, window glass, fixtures, and all other appliances and appurtenances belonging thereto, all equipment used in connection with the leased property, and the sidewalks, curbs, and vaults adjoining or appurtenant to the leased property; provided that the Landlord shall make available to Tenant any warranties or guaranties as may exist with respect to any of the equipment, including the heating and cooling system, contained in the demised premises. Such repairs and replacements shall be in quality and class at least equal to the original work. On default of the Tenant in making such repairs or replacements,

the Landlord may, but shall not be required to, make such repairs and replacements for the Tenant's account, and the expense thereof shall constitute and be collectible as additional rent.

Except as otherwise provided in Article VIII or if caused by any act of God or casualty beyond the control of Tenant, the Tenant shall, at all times during the term, at its own expense, put and maintain in thorough repair and in good and safe condition all buildings and improvements on the leased property, and their equipment and appurtenances, both inside and outside, structural and nonstructural, extraordinary and ordinary, however the necessity or desirability for repairs may occur, and whether or not necessitated by wear, tear, obsolescence, or defects, latent or otherwise.

At the expiration of the lease term, the Tenant shall surrender the leased property in as good condition as it was in at the beginning of the term, reasonable use and wear excepted.

Article VI - Taxes

The Tenant, in addition to the fixed rent provided for herein, shall pay all taxes and assessments upon the leased property, and upon the buildings and improvements thereon, which are assessed during the lease term. All taxes assessed prior to but payable in whole or in installments after the effective date of the lease term, and all taxes assessed during the term but payable in whole or in installments after the lease term, shall be adjusted and prorated, so that the Landlord shall pay its prorated share for the period prior to and for the period subsequent to the lease term and the Tenant shall pay its prorated share for the lease term.

Article VII - Utilities

The Landlord shall not be required to furnish any service to the leased property, including but not limited to heat, water, sewage and power. The Tenant shall pay all charges for steam, gas, electricity, water, light, heat, power, and other services used in or about or supplied to the leased property.

Article VIII - Insurance

Landlord will maintain and pay for adequate general public liability and adequate fire insurance, with extended coverage (in no event less than eighty (80%) percent of the full insurable value) on the Demised Premises and will at Tenant's request furnish Tenant with certificates of insurance or other satisfactory evidence of its compliance with the provisions of this Article. Landlord's insurance maintained under this Article will provide for waiver of subrogation and written proof furnished upon request.

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In the event of damage or destruction to the Demised Premises by fire or other casualty, the Landlord may, to the extent insurance proceeds are available as a result of such damage or destruction, apply same to the cost of restoring, repairing, replacing or rebuilding the premises. To the extent such damage or destruction has rendered the demised premises untenable, in whole or in part, there shall be an abatement of rent as to the untenable part until same is repaired. Provided, moreover, if such repair is not made within six (6) months from the date of damage, Tenant may cancel this lease by written notice to Landlord.

Article IX - Covenants of Tenant

The Tenant covenants and agrees that it shall:

(a) pay the rent when due without notice or demand, provided, that should the rent become more than fifteen (15) days past due the Landlord shall give the Tenant notice in writing to pay within fifteen (15) days after receipt of said notice;

(b) maintain the leased premises clean and in good order, and in substantially the same condition as received, excepting reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire and other casualty over which the Tenant has no control;

(c) comply with all lawful rules, regulations, and laws, provided that the Tenant may adopt such reasonable rules and regulations as it deems fit relating to the use of the premises by it and the other tenants;

(d) use reasonable precautions to protect person and property against fire or other casualty;

(e) give the Landlord notice of any accident or damage;

(f) use reasonable precautions in the conservation of energy and utilities;

(g) allow Landlord reasonable access for inspection.

Article X - Covenants of Landlord

The Landlord covenants and agrees that it shall:

(a) not allow the peaceful enjoyment of the Tenant to the demised premises be disrupted or interfered with by any one claiming under the Landlord or any other person or thing within the control of the Landlord;

(b) not encumber the demised premises by lien or otherwise without the written consent of Tenant.

Article XI - Assigning and Subletting

The Tenant shall have the right to assign or sublet the demised premises without the written consent of the Landlord, provided, however, that notwithstanding such assignment or subletting, Tenant shall remain obligated on the covenants and conditions of this lease unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Landlord.

Article XII - Exemptions

Notwithstanding any other provision of this lease, amendments hereto or incorporations, the Landlord and its principal, agent, or successor hereby grants to the Tenant a waiver and exemption of the following requirements, and the Tenant shall not be required to furnish, provide, or pay for (except as provided in Article VIII) any of the following:

(a) a security deposit for rental, or any other service;

(b) the payment of liquidated, punitive, or penalty damages for any cause or reason;

(c) any kind of indemnity, public liability, fire protection, accident, or other insurance for the protection of the Landlord or any person or property other than the Tenant and its employees, at its option;

(d) any indemnification, release, waiver, or hold harmless agreement, for any cause or reason, it being expressly understood that the Tenant does not waive, either expressly or impliedly, its right to assert sovereign immunity or any other affirmative or defensive right or claim it may have under law.

Article XIII - Holding Over

If the Tenant remains in possession beyond the expiration of this lease, or any extension or renewal hereof, and no negotiation of rent or demand to quit the premises has been given, such holding over shall be deemed a month-to-month tenancy at the same rental and with such other charges as were in effect at the time such holding over takes place.

Article XIV - Condemnation

If the whole of the leased property, or such portion thereof as will make the leased property unsuitable for the purposes herein leased, is condemned for any public use or purpose by any legally constituted authority, then in either of such events this lease shall cease from the time when possession is taken by such public authority and rental shall be accounted for between the Landlord and the Tenant as of the date of the surrender of possession. Such termination shall be without prejudice to the rights of either the Landlord or the Tenant to recover compensation from the condemning authority for any loss or damage caused by such condemnation. Neither the Landlord nor the Tenant shall have any rights in or to any award made to the other by the condemning authority.

Article XV - Cancellation Privilege

Notwithstanding the commencement and expiration dates above set out in paragraph (2) above, it is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this lease is subject to approval by the State Budget and Control Board or its authorized representative, the Division of General Services; if approval is not granted this lease is null and void, ab initio.

It is further understood and agreed that while the lease term as above set out is five (5) years, this lease may be cancelled by the Tenant upon the occurrence of any one or more of the following:

(a) at the end of any fiscal year (June 30) after the commencement date when sufficient appropriations, revenues, income, grants or other funding from whatever source are not available to the Tenant to carry on the purposes or programs of the Tenant with a remainder over of funds to make the rental payments herein agreed, this sufficiency of funds to be solely determined by the State Budget and Control Board; or

(b) at any time upon sixty (60) days' notice when the Tenant is dissolved and no longer performs the function and purposes prescribed to it; or

(c) at any time upon four (4) months' notice when sufficient and adequate square footage or other space is not available for use by the Tenant for normal operations and maximum efficiency, including necessary expansion, to be solely determined by the Tenant and approved by the State Division of General Services; or

(d) upon the breach of any covenant or condition of this lease.

Article XVI - Default

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Except as set out in Article XV, if the Tenant shall at any time fail to pay any amount in accordance with the provisions of this lease, or shall fail to perform any of its other obligations under this lease, then the Landlord, after fifteen (15) days' notice to the Tenant (or without notice in case of an emergency) and without waiving or releasing the Tenant from any obligation of the Tenant contained in this lease, may (but shall be under no obligation to) pay any amount payable by the Tenant hereunder and perform any other act required to be performed by the Tenant hereunder. The Landlord may enter upon the leased property for such purposes and take any action necessary therefor.

If at any time one party shall default in any of its obligations under this lease, the other party may give written notice to the defaulting party of its intention to terminate this lease, together with a statement of the nature of such default. If the default is of such a nature that it cannot be cured within sixty (60) days, necessary steps will be duly and diligently taken to cure such default and if no action is taken the aggrieved party may cancel after sixty (60) days. If the default can be cured within sixty (60) days after notice and is not so cured by the defaulting party, the aggrieved party may cancel after the sixtieth day without further obligation.

Article XVII - Remedies Cumulative; Nonwaiver

No remedy herein or otherwise conferred upon or reserved to Landlord or Tenant shall be considered exclusive of any other remedy, but the same shall be distinct, separate and cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder, or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute; and every power and remedy given by this lease to Landlord or Tenant may be exercised from time to time as often as occasion may arise, or as may be deemed expedient. No delay or omission of Landlord or Tenant to exercise any right or power arising from any default on the part of the other shall impair any such right or power, or shall be construed to be a waiver of any such default, or an acquiescence therein.

Article XVIII - Notice

All notices provided for in this lease shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be given when sent by prepaid registered or certified mail with return receipt requested. Notice to the Landlord shall be addressed to the Landlord at Post Office Box 448, Columbia, South Carolina, 29202, and notice to the Tenant shall be addressed to the attention of the Director of the Tenant at Division of General Services, Bldg. 300, Columbia, S.C., 29201. Each party may, from time to time, by notice as herein provided, designate a different address to which notice to it shall be sent. In addition, Tenant shall, by registered or certified mail, send to the holder of the first lien mortgage or deed of trust on the leased property a copy of any notice of default which it may send to the Landlord if, but only if, such holder has first given Tenant notice of the fact that it holds said mortgage or deed of trust and of the address to which such notices shall be sent.

Article XIX - Short Form

Upon the commencement of the term of this lease, the parties hereto shall execute a memorandum or short form lease agreement, in recordable form specifying the commencement and termination dates of the term hereof and including any such other provisions as Landlord may require.

Article XX - Nature and Extent of Agreement

This lease and the exhibits and rider, if any, attached hereto and forming a part hereof, set forth all the covenants, promises, agreements, conditions and understandings between Landlord and Tenant concerning the demised premises and there are no covenants, promises, agreements, conditions, or understandings, either oral or written, between them other than are herein set forth. Except as herein otherwise provided, no subsequent alteration, amendment, change or addition to this lease shall be binding upon Landlord or Tenant unless reduced to writing and signed by them.

This lease agreement creates only the relationship of Landlord and Tenant between the parties hereto as to the demised premises alone; and nothing herein shall in any way be construed to impose upon either party hereto any obligations or restrictions not herein expressly set forth.

Landlord does not, in any way or for any purpose, become a partner of Tenant in the conduct of its business, or otherwise, or joint adventurer or a member of a joint enterprise with Tenant. The provisions of this lease relating to the rent payable hereunder are included solely for the purpose of providing a method whereby the rent is to be measured and ascertained.

No payment by Tenant or receipt by Landlord of a lesser amount than the monthly rent herein stipulated shall be deemed to be other than on account of the earliest stipulated rent, nor shall any endorsement or statement on any check or any letter accompanying any check or payment as rent be deemed an accord and satisfaction, and Landlord may accept such check or payment without prejudice to Landlord's right to recover the balance of such rent or pursue any other remedy in this lease provided.

Article XII - Binding Effect

This lease shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Landlord and Tenant hereunder, and their respective successors in interest and assigns.

As a prelude to helping the City of Columbia develop the Columbia Canal and Congaree River area, we are proposing the formation of a historic district which would become part of the National Register of Historic Places. This would make the Department of Archives and History and the city eligible to receive funds for the planning and protection of this area which is so important to our city and to the whole Midlands area.

A portion of the property owned by the State of South Carolina and currently used by the South Carolina Highway Department is involved, namely that parcel of land indicated on Columbia City Tax Maps as lot 2-1-3.

We see some possible advantages to you, and no disadvantage, in making your property a part of this district, but to make sure that you understand the proposal, we would like very much to send a representative of this department to meet with you. When National Register districts are proposed, Federal regulations require that property owners be given 30 days notice to ask questions or make comments. In order to arrange a convenient time, our historic preservation staff will telephone your office early in the week of April 17.

The Archives and History Commission will formally consider the historic district proposal at its 10:30 A.M. meeting on May 18, 1978, a meeting which will be open to the public. It will be held at the Department of Archives and History, 1430 Senate Street.

The Columbia Canal/Congaree River area is a very precious part of South Carolina's heritage and we are anxious to help see that its historic, scenic,

Dear Bill:

This is in response to your March 14 letter regarding a request from this office to hire four additional employees in Darlington County to be funded totally from local monies. The previous request by us stipulated that these positions were to be funded from local monies. Actually, the funds to support these four positions are 100% Federal, Public Service Employment. We make these funds available to local entities in order to employ recipients of the Agency's Aid to Families With Dependent Children Program. These people are employed through the Work Incentive Program and supported by the PSE funds. These four positions will provide on the job experience which will enable us to train and subsequently have qualified staff available to assume state funded positions in the Darlington County Day Care Program. When these people become income producing, it will reduce, or eliminate entirely, the public assistance payments they currently receive from AFDC.

I would appreciate your further consideration of our request for these positions.

The problem you stated on the issue of unemployment compensation is one I recognize as a cause for potential funding problems. As you are aware we have many positions on the State Classification and Compensation System which are supported by County/Federal funds. These positions are in addition to our regular State funded allocations.

There are a number of reasons why positions totally funded by the counties could not be effectively utilized by the Agency. First, they would not have access to the Federal Financial Participation. Second, in most programs, staff must be a part of the State Merit System in order to qualify to make decisions on determination of eligibility for the Agency's programs.

I will be most happy to further discuss this matter with you if you desire.

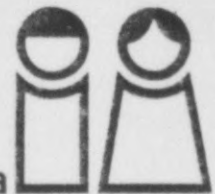

77-78 APPROPRIATION ACT

213

Section 147. The General Assembly hereby expresses its grave concern over the disturbing increase in the number of personnel employed by the State of South Carolina. It is further declared to be the intent of the General Assembly to take positive steps to control and restrict such growth in the future, without unduly hampering the legitimate functions of state government.

In order to increase the efficiency of state government, promote economy and reduce costs, the Budget and Control Board is hereby directed to maintain close supervision over the number of state employees, and to require specifically the following:

1. That no state agency exceed the aggregate number of employees provided in each section of this Act without specific written approval of the Budget and Control Board.
2. That positions created with the acquisition of non-state funds be duly reported to the Budget and Control Board with enumeration of the number of employees and specific funding sources of each.
3. That positions which remain unfilled for more than 12 months be declared non-essential and terminated, and that funds generated from such terminations be returned to the General Fund.
4. That regular reports on the number of filled and unfilled positions for each agency be submitted monthly by the State Personnel Division to the Reorganization Commission, the Budget and Control Board, and the General Assembly.
5. That the Budget and Control Board, in cooperation with the State Reorganization Commission, devise a formal plan for the permanent control and supervision over the number of state employees, which plan would be incorporated as part of the General Appropriations Act for FY 1978-79.
6. That the General Assembly, being the source of compensation, hereby declares its intent to allocate funds sufficient only to take care of personnel that are actually employed by the Agency.

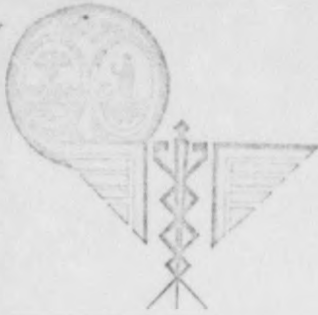

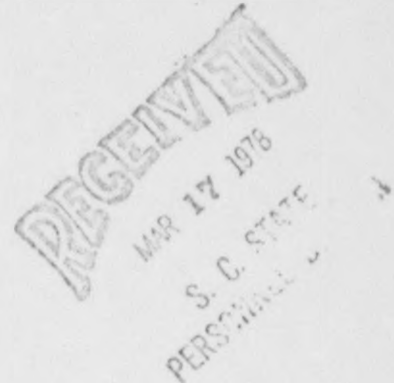

I am in receipt of your letter dated March 8, 1978, concerning Section 147 of the General Appropriations Act for 1977-78.

My staff has compiled information, as per attachments, which falls into five categories:

- I. Committed prior to receipt of instructions
- II. Abolished or filled prior to receipt of instructions
- III. Positions which have not remained vacant more than twelve months
- IV. Positions to be abolished
- V. Positions to be retained

Item IV deserves emphasis. Each position has a "Remark" in the far right column. The majority of these remarks indicate that although the position is being abolished the funds should be retained by this department. In these instances the position is funded from federal and/or local county government sources.

Item V is a list of positions which I strongly advise be retained. Although these positions have remained vacant more than twelve months, they are all funded, needed, and have remained vacant only because of the unavailability of qualified applicants. The positions in question are Nurses, Psychiatrists, Physicians and Psychologists. I would not like to lose the services of a qualified Psychiatrist, for which funds are budgeted, simply because the position has been deleted.

After reading the March 8, 1978, memorandum from Mr. Putnam and Dr. Mullins, I feel it is necessary to give you additional information on the positions listed for our department.

The Director, Library Services position will not be filled this fiscal year. The Court is still in the process of studying a library system and it is not known at this time when we will need the position. There will be no problem for this department to give up the position or funds from the current fiscal year or deleting them from our FY 78/79 request. At the appropriate time, we will submit a new position questionnaire and request additional funds when we have a definite time period as to when the library system will become operational.

The Legal Secretary II position could cause this department some difficulty. Presently all Family and Circuit Court Judges are authorized a secretary by law. In this specific case two circuit judges are sharing a secretary. Here again there will be no problem in giving up the position and funds in the current year and also deleting them from next years request. I would like to point out our department is saving funds by not employing two secretaries and the fact that if either one of our two judges decides the workload is too great or for any other reason that he wants to employ a new secretary, since all judges are authorized a secretary, I would expect to receive the highest priority in re-establishing the position and funding of the position. I realize we must comply to Section 147 and we want to comply, but at the same time please keep in mind at any point in time a decision could be made by either Judge to hire a secre-

Dear Mr. Putnam:

I have intentionally delayed responding to the memorandum of March 8th relating to the abolishment of positions vacant more than twelve months. Specifically, I wanted to respond in writing on a reasoned and logical basis in the hope that the impact of mandates of this type might be carefully considered in the future.

First, let me state that the South Carolina Insurance Commission will not take exception to the abolition of the six vacancies currently being carried on the roster as having been vacant for more than one year. No one appreciates more than I that you are under a legislative mandate to eliminate these positions. However, for the record, I do want to object to the characterization of the positions as "non-essential". These positions which are currently authorized but unfilled are more accurately described as "less essential" than others. I think it is most significant to recall that these positions have not been filled in response to the Governor and the Budget and Control Board's request for a voluntary cutback in balancing of the State's fiscal affairs ever since the latter part of 1975.

Although these positions have been continuously authorized and funded during the past two fiscal years, we have as a matter of good faith, not attempted to fill the vacancies and expend funds which were sorely needed in other areas.



Since the funding margins in personal service monies have been extremely thin for the past three or four years, it is certainly no secret that any additional margins have been used by agencies to fund lump sum annual leave increments at the retirement of employees at the end of a fiscal year. As you know, these payments can be quite substantial. Any surplus funds have also been used to absorb reallocation of positions by State Personnel and this agency has absorbed some \$6,000 of that money over the past two fiscal years. If there were any possibility of reclassifying positions as well as providing promotional money, the funds attributable to these vacancies have been rationed with laser beam surgery.

Finally, the lack of any working margins in personal service funds will absolutely guarantee vacancies being filled with mediocrity. Only the minimum salary will be available and factors of competence, experience and other personal characteristics will be meaningless in terms of job performance.


Although we have prepared the Department of Insurance Five Year Plan in accordance with previously established instructions and objectives, the continuation of establishing, funding and cancelling classified positions will play havoc with any realistic goals and management objectives of a Five Year Plan. I hope that you will not think me impudent in making this inquiry, but I certainly wonder if Pat Smith is aware of this as well as the reports in the media which indicate that there will be frozen funds in the 1978-1979 Budget. I firmly believe that band-aids, temporary expedients and back door solutions impede the efforts of Dr. Mullins to provide a stable, State Personnel management system and seriously impair sound agency management.

I am in receipt of your letter dated March 8, 1978, concerning Section 147 of the General Appropriations Act for 1977-78.

My staff has compiled information, as per attachments, which falls into five categories:

- I. Committed prior to receipt of instructions
- II. Abolished or filled prior to receipt of instructions
- III. Positions which have not remained vacant more than twelve months
- IV. Positions to be abolished
- V. Positions to be retained

Item IV deserves emphasis. Each position has a "Remark" in the far right column. The majority of these remarks indicate that although the position is being abolished the funds should be retained by this department. In these instances the position is funded from federal and/or local county government sources.

Item V is a list of positions which I strongly advise be retained. Although these positions have remained vacant more than twelve months, they are all funded, needed, and have remained vacant only because of the unavailability of qualified applicants. The positions in question are Nurses, Psychiatrists, Physicians and Psychologists. I would not like to lose the services of a qualified Psychiatrist, for which funds are budgeted, simply because the position has been deleted.





We appreciate greatly your assistance and help with these two positions in the memorandum.

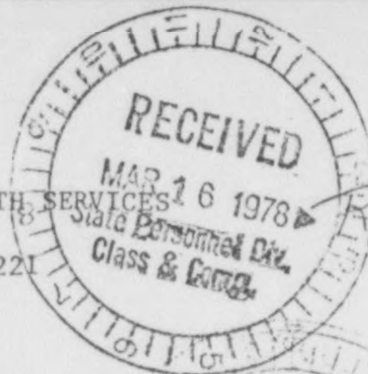

After reading the March 8, 1978, memorandum from Mr. Putnam and Dr. Mullins, I feel it is necessary to give you additional information on the positions listed for our department.

The Director, Library Services position will not be filled this fiscal year. The Court is still in the process of studying a library system and it is not known at this time when we will need the position. There will be no problem for this department to give up the position or funds from the current fiscal year or deleting them from our FY 78/79 request. At the appropriate time, we will submit a new position questionnaire and request additional funds when we have a definite time period as to when the library system will become operational.

The Legal Secretary II position could cause this department some difficulty. Presently all Family and Circuit Court Judges are authorized a secretary by law. In this specific case two circuit judges are sharing a secretary. Here again there will be no problem in giving up the position and funds in the current year and also deleting them from next years request. I would like to point out our department is saving funds by not employing two secretaries and the fact that if either one of our two judges decides the workload is too great or for any other reason that he wants to employ a new secretary, since all judges are authorized a secretary, I would expect to receive the highest priority in re-establishing the position and funding of the position. I realize we must comply to Section 147 and we want to comply, but at the same time please keep in mind at any point in time a decision could be made by either Judge to hire a secre-







I am pleased to offer you the position of State Director of Public Health Nutrition. This position is classified with State Personnel as a Grade 30 and I can offer you a starting salary of \$20,116.

After careful consideration of the attribute of all candidates who were interviewed for the position it was felt that you were the individual best suited to fill the position as it is envisioned.

Job benefits include an excellent Blue-Cross/Blue Shield health insurance program at no cost to you, a state retirement program with payroll deductions of 4% up to \$4800 income and 6% thereafter, 15 days of vacation time earned annually at the rate of one day and two hours per month which can be used in any desirable combinations, approximately 12 paid state holidays, and sick leave of 15 days per year earned also at one day and two hours per month.



This position in the Bacteriology Laboratory has been vacant for twelve months because we have had difficulties in finding suitable applicants who were interested in the position.

About four months ago, we decided that we would like to promote a promising employee from a lower level position in the Bacteriology Laboratory to the vacant position. To be able to promote her, however, she had to pass the HEW Clinical Laboratory Technologist examination in order to qualify through the State Merit System. She took the exam October 28, 1977, but it took several months for her to receive her score. She then applied to the State Merit System and just received her notice of approval.

Dear Mr. Putnam:

I have intentionally delayed responding to the memorandum of March 8th relating to the abolishment of positions vacant more than twelve months. Specifically, I wanted to respond in writing on a reasoned and logical basis in the hope that the impact of mandates of this type might be carefully considered in the future.

First, let me state that the South Carolina Insurance Commission will not take exception to the abolition of the six vacancies currently being carried on the roster as having been vacant for more than one year. No one appreciates more than I that you are under a legislative mandate to eliminate these positions. However, for the record, I do want to object to the characterization of the positions as "non-essential". These positions which are currently authorized but unfilled are more accurately described as "less essential" than others. I think it is most significant to recall that these positions have not been filled in response to the Governor and the Budget and Control Board's request for a voluntary cutback in balancing of the State's fiscal affairs ever since the latter part of 1975.

Although these positions have been continuously authorized and funded during the past two fiscal years, we have as a matter of good faith, not attempted to fill the vacancies and expend funds which were sorely needed in other areas.



Since the funding margins in personal service monies have been extremely thin for the past three or four years, it is certainly no secret that any additional margins have been used by agencies to fund lump sum annual leave increments at the retirement of employees at the end of a fiscal year. As you know, these payments can be quite substantial. Any surplus funds have also been used to absorb reallocation of positions by State Personnel and this agency has absorbed some \$6,000 of that money over the past two fiscal years. If there were any possibility of reclassifying positions as well as providing promotional money, the funds attributable to these vacancies have been rationed with laser beam surgery.

Finally, the lack of any working margins in personal service funds will absolutely guarantee vacancies being filled with mediocrity. Only the minimum salary will be available and factors of competence, experience and other personal characteristics will be meaningless in terms of job performance.

Although we have prepared the Department of Insurance Five Year Plan in accordance with previously established instructions and objectives, the continuation of establishing, funding and cancelling classified positions will play havoc with any realistic goals and management objectives of a Five Year Plan. I hope that you will not think me impudent in making this inquiry, but I certainly wonder if Pat Smith is aware of this as well as the reports in the media which indicate that there will be frozen funds in the 1978-1979 Budget. I firmly believe that band-aids, temporary expedients and back door solutions impede the efforts of Dr. Mullins to provide a stable, State Personnel management system and seriously impair sound agency management.

After reading the March 8, 1978, memorandum from Mr. Putnam and Dr. Mullins, I feel it is necessary to give you additional information on the positions listed for our department.

The Director, Library Services position will not be filled this fiscal year. The Court is still in the process of studying a library system and it is not known at this time when we will need the position. There will be no problem for this department to give up the position or funds from the current fiscal year or deleting them from our FY 78/79 request. At the appropriate time, we will submit a new position questionnaire and request additional funds when we have a definite time period as to when the library system will become operational.

The Legal Secretary II position could cause this department some difficulty. Presently all Family and Circuit Court Judges are authorized a secretary by law. In this specific case two circuit judges are sharing a secretary. Here again there will be no problem in giving up the position and funds in the current year and also deleting them from next years request. I would like to point out our department is saving funds by not employing two secretaries and the fact that if either one of our two judges decides the workload is too great or for any other reason that he wants to employ a new secretary, since all judges are authorized a secretary, I would expect to receive the highest priority in re-establishing the position and funding of the position. I realize we must comply to Section 147 and we want to comply, but at the same time please keep in mind at any point in time a decision could be made by either Judge to hire a secre-

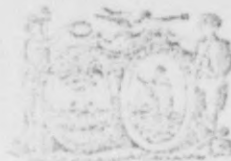

Please see if these positions can be extended, for the following reasons:

PARK SUPT. I -- This is the position authorized and funded for the new Long Bluff State Park in Darlington County. We have development funds for this park and are ready to proceed once we get our permits from the U. S. Corps of Engineers and DEHEC to begin construction. We should get them within 90 days. Design work has been completed and applications made for permits. We haven't wanted to fill the position until construction starts, but that won't be long now. If this existing slot is deleted, we'll just have to turn around in a few weeks and re-apply for it.

HISTORIC SITES COORDINATOR -- (C.T.L.) -- Notification of pending deletion of this slot comes just as we are interviewing applicants to fill the position. We have been holding it open because we've been trying to get our budget in line at C.T.L. (This is a revenue position.) We're okay now and gearing up for our peak summer season, and we need this position on board again. When the lady in this slot left last Spring, she already had her summer programs and other things lined up for the summer. We got by, and held the slot open during the low revenue winter period to help out with the budget. But now we've got to get back on the stick. We've already interviewed to fill this slot. Please see if we can get an okay to move ahead with that process.

I am in receipt of your letter dated March 8, 1978, concerning Section 147 of the General Appropriations Act for 1977-78.

My staff has compiled information, as per attachments, which falls into five categories:

- I. Committed prior to receipt of instructions
- II. Abolished or filled prior to receipt of instructions
- III. Positions which have not remained vacant more than twelve months
- IV. Positions to be abolished
- V. Positions to be retained

Item IV deserves emphasis. Each position has a "Remark" in the far right column. The majority of these remarks indicate that although the position is being abolished the funds should be retained by this department. In these instances the position is funded from federal and/or local county government sources.

Item V is a list of positions which I strongly advise be retained. Although these positions have remained vacant more than twelve months, they are all funded, needed, and have remained vacant only because of the unavailability of qualified applicants. The positions in question are Nurses, Psychiatrists, Physicians and Psychologists. I would not like to lose the services of a qualified Psychiatrist, for which funds are budgeted, simply because the position has been deleted.

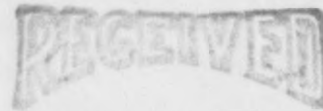



This is in regard to Mr. W. T. Putnam's Memorandum of March 8, 1978, on the subject of abolishment of positions vacant more than twelve months.

The Varitypist II position listed in the Memorandum was in error. The Field Auditor II position has been vacant since October 15, 1976; however, this position was held open during the fiscal year 1977-1978 for the purpose of accomodating the 2½% salary reduction in the 1977-1978 Appropriations Bill; also, to accumulate funds needed to fill new positions created in the Property Tax Division to administer the Education Finance Act.

We have had several vacant positions in this class in the last twelve months which have been filled and could easily have replaced the position held open.

The abolishment of this position and the deletion of funds generated from this vacancy would further decrease funds in our Personnel Account, and create additional shortages.

We would appreciate the reinstatement of this position as soon as possible.



Dear Mr. McPherson:

Reference is made to today's conference concerning your requirement of an approved manual or automatic sprinkler system to be provided in Village A, for the reason that restraint is practiced in Village A. Requirement for an approved manual or automatic sprinkler system under these circumstances is contained in Section 901.8(b) of the 1976 Edition, 1977 Revision, of the Standard Building Code, which is the manual for permanent building projects as filed with the Secretary of State, and applicable to buildings constructed by the State or its various agencies. It is my understanding that the Mental Health Commission has requested you to waive the requirement of an automatic sprinkler system. You have refused to waive this requirement.

The question now raised is the remedy of the Mental Health Commission to appeal or challenge your determination not to waive the requirement in question. Section 111 of the Standard Building Code contemplates a Board of Adjustments and Appeals, with Section 112 governing the time limit for appeals and Section 113 relating to decisions of the Board of Adjustments and Appeals concerning variations and modifications. It is my understanding that the State of South Carolina has never established a Board of Adjustments and Appeals to review decisions of the State engineer effecting compliance with



various provisions of the Standard Building Code. The administrative remedy for the Mental Health Commission in seeking a variation or modification from your decision with respect to the sprinkler system in Village A would be by appeal to the Board of Adjustments and Appeals, and I would recommend that the State Budget & Control Board, which constitutes the chief appointing authority within contemplation of Section 111.1 of the Southern Building Code, establish and designate such a Board at the State level. (It is my understanding that most municipalities and counties using the Standard Building Code have established Boards of Adjustments and Appeals to handle the type situation as here involved at these local levels.) It would seem that the Budget & Control Board should also create such a Board at the State level.

SECTION 111 — BOARD OF ADJUSTMENTS AND APPEALS

111.1 — APPOINTMENT

There is hereby established a board to be called the Board of Adjustments and Appeals, which shall consist of five (5) members. Such Board shall be composed of one Architect, one General Contractor or Engineer and three Members at large from the building industry. The said Board shall be appointed by the Chief Appointing Authority.

111.2 — TERM OF OFFICE

Of the members first appointed two (2) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, two (2) for a term of two (2) years, one (1) for a term of three (3) years, and thereafter they shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years. Vacancies shall be filled for an unexpired term in the manner in which original appointments are required to be made. Continued absence of any member from regular meetings of the Board shall, at the discretion of the Chief Appointing Authority, render any such member liable to immediate removal from office.

111.3 — QUORUM

Three (3) members of the board shall constitute a quorum. In varying the application of any provisions of this code or in modifying an order of the Building Official, affirmative votes of the majority present, but not less than three (3) affirmative votes shall be required. A board member shall not act in a case in which he has a personal interest.

111.4 — RECORDS

The Building Official shall act as Secretary of the Board of Adjustments and Appeals and shall make a detailed record of all its proceedings, which shall set forth the reasons for its decisions, the vote of each member participating therein, the absence of a member, and any failure of a member to vote.

111.5 — PROCEDURE

The board shall establish rules and regulations for its own procedure not inconsistent with the provisions of this code. The board shall meet at regular intervals, to be determined by the Chairman, or in any event, the board shall meet within ten (10) days after notice of appeal has been received.

SECTION 112 — APPEALS

112.1 — TIME LIMIT

(a) Whenever the Building Official shall reject or refuse to approve the mode or manner of construction proposed to be followed, or materials to be used in the erection or alteration of a building or structure, or when it is claimed that the provisions of this code do not apply, or that an equally good or more desirable form of construction can be employed in any specific case, or when it is claimed that the true intent and meaning of this code or any of the regulations thereunder have been misconstrued or wrongly interpreted, the owner of such building or structure, or his duly authorized agent, may appeal from the decision of the Building Official to the Board of Adjustments and Appeals. Notice of appeal shall be in writing and


