Dear Governor and Mrs. Sanford,

I hope this email finds you both well. I am writing you tonight to ask for your opinion and possibly some help on a matter that concerns a state agency. I know my email will probably be lengthy and I will apologize in advance for it. I am just at my wits end and do not know where to turn. Basically, I feel that I am being borderline harassed by my ex husband about his having to pay child support and he is using DSS Child Support Enforcement to do it. I personally think it is not right nor fair for someone like him to abuse this agency and use it for their own advantage.

First of all, a little background on me: I was married to my ex husband for 14 years. I left him three days before I gave birth to our youngest child. When I left, he refused to help me in any way financially because he wanted me to fail so I would have no other choice but to come back to him. I was forced to go on welfare. As you know, when you apply for welfare benefits, they make you file for DSS child support enforcement if you have a child's non custodial parent who will not or is not supporting their children. I also had a private attorney at the time who filed for divorce in [REDACTED] County on my behalf at this time. It was my private attorney who in fact got child support started through family court and paid through family court for my children. The agency DSS Child Support Enforcement did not initiate my children's child support.

To make a long story short, I was on welfare a very short time, my attorney got my child support started and I was able to go to school get a certificate and ending up getting a great job with [REDACTED] County. I now work for a [REDACTED] County Summary Court. I am telling you this because I worked hard to pull myself up from being a single mother of three kids with NOTHING to be where I am today. I am a home owner, I am a tax payer, and I am a productive citizen. I used the welfare system for what it is intended for.... a step UP.....NOT a hand out and I am very proud of myself for doing so.

What my ex husband has done is manage to lose his great paying job he had when we were married and he makes no real effort to find gainful employment again. He says he does not want to get a good paying job because he will just have to pay me half of his paycheck in child support. When we separated, he made nearly 50,000.00 a year working for a Toyota dealership as an automotive technician. He keeps going to DSS Child Support Enforcement, paying the 40.00 fee and hauling ME back into court to try to get it reduced. He did this about a year ago, and we went to court. I had an attorney with me and we told the caseworker we would not agree to a reduction in child support because he was not employed to his ability. (He was claiming at the time to be making LESS than the minimum wage.) The caseworker said they would set the case to go before a Family Court Judge. The court date was set and when we arrived for court and the people at DSS Child Support Enforcement told me and my attorney they had closed his case and that if he wanted his child support reduced, he would have to hire a private attorney and bring it before the court that way.

I have recently received yet another letter in the mail from DSS Child Support Services. The letter informs me that I have a negotiation conference concerning my child support case to be held at 2:30 on December 12, 2008 at the Family Court in [REDACTED] County. That it is necessary that I be present at this conference. It also states that if I fail to appear for the conference, they will request that my TANF check

be reduced or if I do not receive a TANF check, they will request that my case be closed. I have not received any kind of check TANF or otherwise from DSS since sometime in 1999! So to be quite honest, I considered not even going. I am not receiving any form of welfare and haven't in years, so I figured I had nothing to lose. Then the next thing I know, I am being SERVED a paper by a deputy sheriff at my home. The officer who served them said they were for me. They read like they are for my ex husband. HIS name is on it like they have served the papers on HIM...only they were served to ME...at MY home. Now I can only assume that I am being required to take time off of work again to go to court again. I have to find an attorney to go with me again. All because I have an ex husband who doesn't want to get a decent job so he can afford to pay child support for his children. He wants to pay the bare minimum for child support. I know they will reduce it based solely on the only the guidelines because he isn't even working now at all. His Mother pays his child support for him and he is a 43 year old man.

I guess what I need to know is this possible? Can a man go pay a 40.00 fee to a state agency that is supposed to establish child support for children and get it reduced or taken away? Even when he is capable of making a decent amount of pay? He just chooses not to? It seems to me that his life's goal now is to go ON welfare himself. So he doesn't get a good job, he gets Food Stamps and Medicaid and now all he wants to do is get his child support reduced to the bare minimal of about 40.00 a week so he can be a lazy dead beat dad. I just don't think that is right or just. Especially when I have worked so hard to overcome the hardships that my children and I have been through over the years. Also, how often can this man keep making me come to court through DSS Child Support Enforcement? If I am not mistaken, I can't take him back for a review of his wages but once every 3 years. (Which I never have.) I don't believe it has been 3 years since he had me in there last time.

Again, I do apologize for the length of this email. I just felt that someone needed to know how one man, in my opinion, is abusing a state agency. I am looking forward to your reply. I am almost certain you will be nearly as outraged as I am.

You may be pleased to know that Senator Lee Bright has introduced a similar resolution, S. 424, in the Senate declaring South Carolina's sovereignty under the 10th Amendment, and a companion resolution, H. 3509, has been introduced by Representative Mike Pitts in the House of Representatives. If passed, both resolutions will be sent to various federal officials, including the President and the leaders of the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate.

Because these bills are in the form of resolutions, no action is required by Governor Sanford. I've had several requests for updates on the Lowcountry Coosaw luncheons we've been doing.

We've gotten together several times for discussions over lunch. We had an excellent turnout at the last gathering, as approximately 20 people came out for fellowship. That is more than double the attendance we had at the previous meeting, and the interest continues to grow at an impressive rate!

In our last luncheon a few weeks ago we heard a presentation from Governor Sanford's former Deputy Chief of Staff, Chad Walldorf. After being dismayed at what he found during his two years in state government (see the attachment showing the \$24 billion debt of our state's retirement system), Chad sold his business to spend his time advancing the conservative cause - largely through his role as Chairman of SC Club for Growth. The organization helps support conservative incumbents and often recruits challengers for targeted yet winnable races. Over the past two cycles their endorsed candidates have won 70% of their races.

The SC Club for Growth PAC played a significant role in helping many reform-minded challengers defeat eight Republican incumbents in the June 2008 primaries. These primary elections are critically important in bringing real change to a state with gerrymandered legislative districts designed to protect incumbents. Specifically, that means the Club needs your support to research and produce TV ads, radio spots, and mail pieces in key 2010 primaries like the races for Governor, Treasurer, Comptroller General, and State House.

In closing, Chad said "elections matter." Last year's victories mean that over twenty new fiscal conservatives are serving in the legislature - more than doubling the number of real reformers in the House and Senate.
