SCDOT's Friday, Dec. 11, Update

On the Flooding Impacts in South Carolina

South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) Interim Secretary Christy A. Hall has issued her Friday, Dec. 11, update on the transportation system in South Carolina.

Secretary Hall's report has information including:

- State road closures are down from a peak of **541** (Oct. 5) to **53** (Dec. 11), a **90 percent** decrease.
- To open roads as quickly as possible, SCDOT Maintenance forces responded across the state and contractors were used where additional assistance and expertise were required.
- The historic flood impacted 221 bridges in South Carolina. The vast majority have returned to service after inspections, assessments and repairs. At least 18 bridges will require full replacement as a result of the storm. SCDOT is fast tracking replacement of these bridges and most will be constructed within 150 days of contract award.
- SCDOT does not own or maintain dams. Roads crossing or adjacent to dams will be returned to service following the dam's certification by DHEC.
- Debris collected to date: approx. 2,300 loads (110,000 cubic yards)
