Dear Dr. Liggett: *Pete*

This letter is a follow-up to our recent meeting regarding several issues pertaining to the potential for changes to the state plan which impact therapeutic foster care and its constituent foster parents. As you know, these agencies bill under the RBHS program for a portion of their rate, as Medicaid does not pay for room and board for the child in care.

During our meeting, we discussed the chilling effect that unbundling has had on this sector of our membership. We also discussed our recent visit to meet with CMS officials in Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. Waldrep and Ms. Carlton talked about your efforts with the alcohol and drug agencies to take another look at the SPA. We were encouraged that we may be able to put together a group of child serving organizations to work toward something that may remediate the strain of documentation and billing requirements such as a daily service unit.


I would appreciate hearing from you on how we may proceed to work as partners to develop a proposal to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

Thanks for your time and consideration.

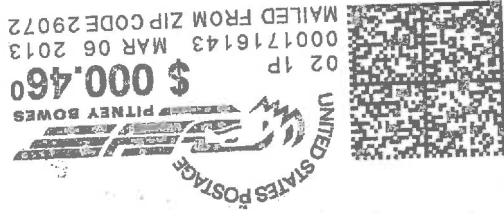

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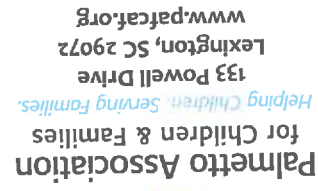

Hi Paula,

I hope this finds you well and ready for a relaxing weekend.

I realize I haven't yet responded to your letter dated March 6, 2013 regarding the services provided in the therapeutic foster care realm. I will be gone next week but would like to speak with you soon after I return April 1st about potential strategies for addressing services for TFC. In response to your reference of the addictive services/RBHS SPA – our work on that project was a year-long effort that required immense amounts of time from all parties involved. As I mentioned in the meeting, it is my thought that any sort of efforts to address TFC ought to be considered within the broader context of a larger project to move RBHS into a coordinated care model. I'm certainly open to hearing your thoughts on that and would like to discuss this further. I will ask Annie McCanne to set up a time for us to meet.
