Soon after the University Terrace housing project was opened, a branch of the Richland county public library was established there. Now Gonzales Gardens and the Andrew Jackson Homes have been added to the list of those receiving library service.

At Gonzales Gardens and the University Terrace, permanent branch library collections have been placed in the recreational rooms of the projects. These collections are supplemented each month with new books and requests for specific material received from the residents are supplies as far as possible.

The Andrew Jackson Homes have direct service from the county book truck, which stops there every two weeks on its regular rounds. This new service has met with great success and received an enthusiastic welcome from the residents and officials of the project.
