Shutdown Impact, USC Aiken, and Credit Monitoring -- Update from Sen. Tom Young -- September 11, 2013 to October 8, 2013

SRS -- Impact of Federal Government Shutdown

Latest Information from DOE : As of yesterday, DOE stated that as a result of the lapse in appropriations and the nature of available funding, DOE directed Savannah River Remediation (SRR), the liquid waste disposition contractor at the Savannah River Site (SRS), to execute the furlough of employees yesterday. Employees needed to maintain liquid waste facilities in a safe and non-operating mode will not be furloughed. Affected employees will be furloughed until Congress acts on a resolution to fund the liquid waste program. However, if a resolution is not achieved in the near term, DOE will have to take further action. SRR furloughed 1440 employees on Friday, Oct. 4, 2013 and placed liquid waste operations in safe standby condition. DOE says that there are no other furlough announcements for other contractors yet. SRNS continues to assess their current funding situation in view of the government shutdown.

Credit Monitoring Update

What is the latest? : Two weeks ago, the State Budget and Control Board issued an Intent to Award a contract to **CSIdentify Corporation (CSID)** for the purpose of continuing credit monitoring/ID protection services to South Carolinians and businesses affected by the October 2012 data breach of state computers. CSID's services provided under the contract will be available to eligible individual taxpayers (including minors and adult dependents) and eligible business taxpayers affected by the Department of Revenue security breach of 2012 beginning

October 24, 2013. Services for enrolled participants will end on October 31, 2014.

CSID will make the following services available to eligible individuals:

- **Daily Transunion (credit agency) credit monitoring.**
- **Change of address monitoring** : Monitors and reports if and when an enrolled participant's mail has been redirected to a new address.
 - **Pay Day loan monitoring** : Alerts enrolled participants if a pay day loan is established using their identity.
- **Court and Criminal records monitoring** : Tracks municipal court systems and alerts enrolled participants if a criminal act is committed using their identity.
 - **Social Security Number trace** : Monitors and notifies enrolled participants when fraudulent names, aliases, and addresses become associated with their SSN.
 - **Cyber monitoring** : Alerts enrolled participants to their information being bought/sold/traded in the online black market.
- **Child identity monitoring** : Provides a report of all the names, addresses, and aliases found in public records associated with enrolled children's SSN. Also monitors for a child's information being bought/sold/traded in the online black market.
 - **One million dollar identity theft insurance policy** .
- **Full service identity restoration services** : Offered to all eligible persons even if they have not enrolled in the CSID services.

CSID will make the following services available to eligible businesses:

- **Monitor Service** : Monitors for information concerning business domain names, credentials, and static IP address information as provided by businesses.
- **Business Alerts** : Alerts businesses in real time to incidences of compromised credentials and malware.

What Should You Do? : CSID will provide more information about the enrollment process on or before October 24, 2013. Eligible persons currently enrolled in Experian services do not have to wait for their Experian coverage to expire to enroll with CSID. As your state senator, I will send out the information by email as soon as I have it.

Who is CSID? : CSID is a Texas based company which not only offers credit monitoring, but also provides identify monitoring solutions along with full service identity theft restoration services.

How Long is the Contract and the Cost? : The State will pay \$8.5 Million for the first year of the CSID contract with the option to renew for four additional one year periods at the state's sole discretion. The Experian contract for the past year was a \$12 Million contract.

What If I Purchase My Own Credit and/or Identity Protection? : If you choose to purchase your own protection service, you can deduct a portion of that cost from your state income taxes.

What Should I Do If Experian Sends Me An Option to Renew? : The Experian service is good for one year of monitoring from the date that you signed up. Experian began sending out renewal solicitations two weeks ago. These emails may confuse you. You can certainly choose to accept Experian's offer but it will be on your dime and the State will not pay for the renewal of the Experian service for you. DEW Unemployment Trust Fund Update : The S.C. Department of Employment and Workforce (DEW) released its annual report last week providing information about the state's unemployment taxes, unemployment benefit payments, federal loan payments, and the state's trust fund balance. To pay unemployment benefits, the state borrowed almost \$1 Billion from the federal government between December 2008 and April 2011. To date, \$545 Million has been paid back. The state is scheduled to repay the entire amount by the end of 2015. To see the full report, go [here](#).
